## AIR FORCE NOTES

Air Force concluded the regular season with a 7-5 overall mark and finished fourth in the Mountain West Conference with a 5-3 mark.  
Air Force will be going to a post-season bowl game for the third straight season. This season marks the first time since 1990-92 that Air Force has played in three straight bowl games and played in the same bowl three consecutive years. The Falcons played in four consecutive Liberty Bowls from 1989-91.  
Troy Calhoun is the first head coach in school history to take his team to a post-season bowl game in his first three seasons. Calhoun (Air Force, 1989) has a 24-14 record in his third season at Air Force. Calhoun is 16-8 vs. the Mountain West, 14-4 at home, 9-8 in road games, 1-2 in neutral site games, 8-6 in non-conference games and 0-2 in bowl games.

## BOWL HISTORY

Air Force will play in its 20th bowl game in 2009. The Falcons are 8-10-1 all-time in bowls.

## THIS IS AIR FORCE FOOTBALL

■ Air Force has an all-time record of 327-274-13 in its 54th season of varsity football. The Falcons are 177-113-3 at home and 150-161-10 on the road and in neutral site games. AFA has played in 19 bowl games and has an 8-10-1 all-time record.

■ This season marks the third under head coach Troy Calhoun, who is a 1989 graduate of the Air Force Academy. He is the sixth head coach in school history and first graduate to hold the position.

■ Air Force is playing in its 30th year in a conference. This season marks the school's 11th year in the Mountain West Conference. Prior to 1999, Air Force was a member of the Western Athletic Conference from 1980-98. The school was an independent prior to 1980.

■ Air Force is 42-40 as a member of the Mountain West Conference. The team is 25-16 at home and 17-24 on the road. The Falcons are 73-59 overall since joining the MWC in 1999, including marks of 42-24 at home, 27-31 on the road, 4-4 in neutral site games and 2-2 in bowls.

## THE SERIES

Air Force and Houston will play for the third time in 15 months when the schools meet in the Armed Forces Bowl. The teams first played on Sept. 13 last season in a game moved from Houston to Dallas due to weather. Air Force won the game, 31-28. The two then played in the 2008 Armed Forces Bowl on Dec. 31. The Cougars won the game, 34-28.

## THE 2008 MEETINGS

### Sept. 13, 2008 - Dallas, TX

Air Force rolled with the punches and picked up a big non-conference road victory, defeating Houston, 31-28, in Dallas, Texas. The game was moved to Dallas and played at SMU due to hurricane Ike. The day prior to the game, the start time was moved to 9 a.m. MT, which is the earliest start time in school history.

Shea Smith had a career day to lead Air Force, as he rushed for a career-high 93 yards, scored a career-high three touchdowns and notched a career-long run of 41 yards to lead the Falcons. Sophomore tailback Kyle Lumpkin added 74 yards on 20 carries, while sophomore WR-Z Kyle Halderman added 66 yards on 11 carries and fellow sophomore tailback Savier Stephens chipped in with 60 yards on 14 carries and scored his first touchdown of the year. The Falcon rushed for 380 yards while not completing a pass for just the fifth time in school history and first time since 1992, going 0-7 on the day.

The Falcons trailed for the first time all season when Houston's Case Keenum hit Mark Hafner with a 14-yard scoring toss to give the Cougars a 7-0 first-quarter lead. The Falcons answered with a Ryan Harrison 30-yard field goal. Smith and Stephens added touchdown runs in the second quarter to give Air Force a 17-7 halftime lead.

Air Force extended the lead to 31-7 late in the third quarter on a pair of Smith touchdown runs.

Houston answered Smith's third score with a Keenum TD pass to Andrew Kohn to cut the lead to 31-14 heading into the fourth quarter. Keenum added two more scoring tosses in the final stanza to make up the final margin, the last coming with just under four minutes remaining. Air Force returned an onside kick and ran out the clock to end the game.

Keenum finished the day hitting 34 of 57 passes for 362 yards and four touchdowns. He also rushed for 75 yards on 10 carries. Tyron Carrier had eight catches for 91 yards.

Air Force's defense was led by sophomore inside linebacker Ken Lamendola, who had a career-best 12 tackles. Luke Yeager added a career-best eight tackles and a fumble recovery while senior defensive end Jake Paulson added seven total tackles and 2.5 quarterback sacks. Reggie Rembert chipped in with six solo tackles, including two tackles for loss, and added a career-best 53 yard punt return to set up a touchdown.

### Dec. 31, 2008 - Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl

Case Keenum ran for two touchdowns and threw for another and the Cougars wrapped up head coach Kevin Sumlin's first season with a 34-28 victory over Air Force in the Armed Forces Bowl for their first bowl victory since 1980. The game was a rematch of a hurricane-disrupted game in September that Air Force won, 31-28.

Bryce Beall opened the scoring with a one-yard run to give Houston a 7-0 lead after Air Force fumbled the opening kickoff. Jared Tew answered with a two-yard run to tie the game, but the Cougars answered with 10 points to take a 17-7 lead at the end of the first quarter. Tim Jefferson scored on a five-yard run and Ryan Harrison added a 44-yard field goal to tie the score at halftime. Houston took the lead for good with a Keenum TD run early in the third quarter and the team's exchanged scores from that point.

Houston finished the game with 427 total yards. Keenum had 252 yards passing while Beall earned MVP honors with 135 yards and a score on 22 carries. The Falcons finished with 387 total yards, including 278 rushing. Tew led the way with an Air Force bowl-record 149 yards on 27 carries to earn team MVP honors. Jefferson added 98 yards on seven of 14 passing.

### BOWL REMATCH RARE

For only the seventh-time in the history of collegiate football bowl competition, two schools will face each other in back-to-back post-season games as Air Force and Houston meet in the Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl.

Previous bowl games with back-to-back match-ups were the Cotton (1970-1971, Notre Dame and Texas; 1993-1994, Notre Dame and Texas A&M), Rose (1973-1974-1995, USC and Ohio State), Orange (1990-1991, Notre Dame and Colorado; 1993-1994, Florida State and Nebraska) and the Outback (2001-2002, South Carolina and Ohio State). Three of the previous six match-ups featured splits with Notre Dame (Texas A&M), Florida State and South Carolina completing two-game sweeps.

### AIR FORCE VS. CONFERENCE-USA

Air Force is 1-1 all-time against teams in Conference-USA. Both meetings came against Houston in 2008 at neutral sites. The Falcons defeated Houston, 31-28, in Dallas, Texas, on Sept. 13. The game was moved from Houston due to weather. The Cougars defeated Air Force, 34-28, later that year at the Armed Forces Bowl.

The Falcons are 26-8 all-time against teams that are currently in C-USA. Air Force played them all prior to the teams joining the conference. All of the opponents below are from the West Division. Air Force has never played a team from the East Division.

More Air Force players call Texas home than any other state. The Falcons roster has 23 players from the Lone Star state, including four of the five starting offensive linemen. In addition, two coaches are from the state. Co-offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach Blane Morgan is from Dallas, while running game coordinator/running backs coach Jemal Singleton is from San Antonio. Head coach Troy Calhoun also has ties to Texas as the offensive coordinator for the NFL's Houston Texans in 2006.

### TOP PASSING OFFENSE, DEFENSE MEET

Houston has the nation's top-rating passing game while Air Force counters with the nation's top-rated passing defense. The Cougars lead the nation in passing with an average of 450 yards per game. Air Force leads the nation in pass defense, allowing just 148.7 yards per game. The Cougars lead the nation in total offense with a 581.23 per-game average and are ranked second in scoring offense with a 43.92 average. Air Force ranks ninth nationally in scoring defense with a 15.3 mark and are 10th in total defense with a 284.8 average.

### ACADEMICS AND FOOTBALL

The Air Force football team once again has the top Graduation Success Rate (GSR) in the Mountain West Conference in the recently released report for 1999-2002. Air Force's 87 percent is followed by Colorado State and TCU with 65. The national average for FBS schools was 64 percent. In preparation for the bowl game, Air Force football players will take over 900 final exams in 70 courses.

### AIR FORCE VS. RANKED TEAMS

Houston, ranked 25th in the USA Today poll, is the fourth ranked team Air Force has played this season. Air Force is 0-3 this season vs. ranked teams. The Falcons hosted then-No. 10/9 TCU on Oct. 10 (TCU, 20-17), then-No. 19/20 Utah Oct. 24 in Salt Lake City (Utah, 23-16 OT) and then-No. 19/18 BYU on Nov. 21 (BYU 38-21) in Provo. The Falcons are 14-67-4 all-time vs. ranked teams. Air Force has lost 14 straight games to ranked opponents since winning at No. 23 California, 23-21, in 2002. The Falcons were 0-3 vs. ranked team last season, dropping games to No. 20 Utah (23-30), No. 16/18 BYU (24-38) and No. 15/17 TCU (10-44).

### PLAYING BEST WHEN IT MATTERS MOST

Air Force is 13-5 under head coach Troy Calhoun in games during the second half of the season (last six games), including a 4-2 mark this year. Air Force was 5-1 in 2007 which is the best mark since the

## DEFENSIVE NOTES

- The Falcons rank second in the conference and 10th nationally in total defense, allowing just 284.8 yards per game. The mark is the seventh-best in Air Force history and best since the 1966 team allowed just 278 yards per game.
- Air Force leads the nation in passing defense with a 148.7 average.
- The unit has also allowed just 50-165 (30.3) third down conversions which ranks second in the conference and seventh in the nation.
- Air Force is second in the MWC and third in the nation in opponent first downs, allowing just 172.
- The Falcons lead the conference and rank 12th in the nation in red zone defense with a 74.1 mark.

## Falcons honoring troops



The Air Force Academy football team is honoring the Air Force and several different units throughout the season by wearing patches on its uniforms. The team will wear the Air Force patch to honor the men and women of the U.S. Air Force.

The team will also honor 10 of the Air Force's Heritage Wings and Groups by wearing patches on their home uniforms; and six USAF Air and Space Expeditionary Wings by wearing patches on their away uniforms for the third straight year. The team will wear the Air Force logo on both uniforms for the first time in 2008.

The Heritage Wings and Groups date back to the foundations of the Air Force, beginning on Aug. 1, 1907, when the U.S. Army Signal Corps established a small Aeronautical Division to take "charge of all matters pertaining to military ballooning, air machines and all kindred subjects." But, it was not until May 26, 1909, that military aviation was born, when Lts. Frank P. Lahm and Benjamin D. Foulois made their first ascent and qualified as the airship's first Army pilots. The National Security Act of 1947 created a separate Department of the Air Force, headed by a Secretary of the Air Force; from that law, today's Air Force was officially born on Sept. 18, 1947.

The 10 patches represent active duty units that have colorful and distinguished histories. These "heritage units" not only represent the legacy of the Air Force past, but also the promise of its future. Each Air Force mission and capability is represented with this cross-section of units. The Air and Space Expeditionary Force concept is the Air Force's vision for the 21st century to organize, train, equip and deploy forces for contingency operations while remaining ready to meet national crises. AEF also helps create a mindset and culture that embraces the unique characteristics of air and space power - range, speed, flexibility and precision. Military personnel that are deployed become a part of one of these six wings.

Air Force's seven selections to the first and second teams is the most ever in the MWC and most since 1998 when the Falcons had eight players named to the first two teams in the Western Athletic Conference.

#### REMBERT RETURN GAME

Junior Reggie Rembert is Air Force's career leader in kickoff returns and KOR yardage with 64 for 1,373 yards. Rembert broke the records of All-American Ernie Jennings (1868-70), who had 43 returns for 1,037 yards. Rembert is the Mountain West Conference's active career leader. He ranks fifth in conference history overall in returns and third in return yards. *Please see charts on page nine for complete list of leaders.*

## Head Coach Troy Calhoun

Sometimes people seem born for a particular job or situation. That has never been the case more than Troy Calhoun being the head football coach at the Air Force Academy.

The Air Force Academy's purpose is to develop young people of strong character who graduate and serve as outstanding leaders for our country. Air Force student-athletes must complete one of the nation's most demanding academic curriculums while further embedding the kind of heart and character that are a crucial foundation for service. It's a purpose Calhoun thoroughly respects and appreciates. While embracing the mission of the Academy, Calhoun has also found a way to build a very competitive football program within one of college football's strongest conferences.

Calhoun is the only coach in the 100-plus year history of service academy football to lead teams to at least eight regular-season wins and a bowl game in each of his first two seasons. He added another significant accomplishment this season, as he became the only coach in Air Force history to win at least seven regular season games three straight years.

His players have also been amazingly successful finishing their academic and leadership responsibilities. The Air Force football team's most recent NCAA APR is an astounding 983 which once again places the Academy amongst the nation's top three in the sport of football. A total of 58 players (from the Academy classes of 2008-12) have started at least one game since Calhoun became head coach. All 36 members of that group from the classes of 2008-09 have graduated from the Academy and are currently serving on active duty in the Air Force. There are 21 players from the classes of 2010, 2011 and 2012 that are on track to graduate with their respective classmates.

Calhoun has also lifted the Falcon football program to unprecedented heights within the Mountain West Conference in his three seasons. Calhoun is 24-14 in three seasons after taking over a program that had posted three straight losing seasons before his arrival. They have posted wins at Notre Dame and Utah and led the Falcons to three straight bowl games for the first time since becoming a member of the MWC.

In Mountain West Conference play, Calhoun is 16-8, the most MWC wins in school history in a three-year span. The 16 wins is the fourth most for Air Force over three years in its conference history and most since 1996-98. His conference winning percentage is the fourth best in MWC history.

Air Force, coming off a three straight losing seasons, finished the 2007 season 9-4 overall and placed second in the Mountain West Conference with a 6-2 mark in Calhoun's first year. The Falcons earned their first bowl bid in five seasons, advancing to the Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl in Fort Worth, Texas.

The five-game turnaround from the previous season, was the largest in the nation by a first-year head coach and tied as the third-largest overall in the nation. The five-game turnaround is the best in school history since the 1958 team had a school-record turnaround of six games.

Calhoun was named the conference's coach of the year for his efforts. In addition, he was named coach of the year in Region 5 by the American Football Coaches Association and was one of eight finalists for national coach of the year honors. Last year, Calhoun followed up with an impress 8-5 record and a fourth place finish in the MWC with a 5-3 mark. The Falcons were selected for their second straight Armed Forces Bowl appearance.

Calhoun brought a wealth of experience and impressive resume at the collegiate and professional levels that is flooded with success at every stop to the Academy. Calhoun came to the Academy after serving as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach for the Houston Texans in 2006. The Texans were one of only two NFL teams to triple their number of wins from the previous year.

Calhoun became a well-rounded NFL coach, working as a defensive assistant, special teams assistant and offensive assistant with the Denver Broncos from 2003-05. He began his NFL coaching career by serving as the defensive assistant under defensive coordinator Larry Coyer in 2003.

Prior to the NFL, Calhoun was an offensive coordinator for six seasons on the collegiate level. He began his coaching career at Air Force, where he worked as a graduate assistant from 1989-90. He started at quarterback for the Academy in 1986 and was one of only two freshmen to letter for the 1985 team that finished fifth in the final polls with a 12-1 record that included wins over national powers Notre Dame and Texas.

Calhoun served his country from 1989-95 as an active duty officer in the Air Force. He was the Falcons' recruiting coordinator and the junior varsity offensive coordinator in 1993-94.

He moved to Ohio University in 1995 where he served as the quarterbacks coach for two seasons. Calhoun was promoted to offensive coordinator in 1997. Calhoun moved to Wake Forest in 2001 and remained there prior to his stint with the Broncos.

Groomed on the basics of integrity and passion, Calhoun is a native of Roseburg, Ore., and was raised in a home where both kids graduated from the Air Force Academy and were varsity letterwinners on nationally-ranked teams. Calhoun's younger sister, Callie, is a 1991 Academy graduate and four-year letterwinning in track and cross country. Calhoun finished at the Academy on the superintendents' list and graduated with over a 3.0 grade point average and a military performance average of better than 3.0. He and his wife, Amanda, live in Colorado Springs and have two children, Tyler (eight) and Amelia (six).
