2010 BELL HELICOPTER ARMED FORCES BOWL - A school from Conference USA is scheduled to compete in the 2010 **Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl** for the seventh year against an institution from Mountain West Conference. A C-USA school has played in the first four **Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl** games before missing the 2007 game when Cal from the Pacific-10 Conference filled the spot. The Mountain West Conference has been represented the past four years, including three-straight appearances by the United States Air Force Academy. The 2006, 2008 and 2009 **Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl** featured C-USA and the Mountain West. The MWC won the 2006 meeting as Utah defeated Tulsa 25-13 in 2006 while Houston evened the mark for CUSA with a 34-28 win in 2008 over Air Force. The Falcons rebounded in 2009 by posting a 47-20 win over Houston before a record crowd of 41,414 at Amon G. Carter Stadium.

BELL HELICOPTER ARMED FORCES BOWL TICKETS - Tickets for the 2010 **Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl** can be obtained by calling the bowl office at (817/810-0012) or by visiting the bowl's official Web site: <http://www.armedforcesbowl.com/>. Ticket prices for the 2009 **Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl** were \$50 for sideline seats, \$40 for upper-deck seats and \$20 for end-zone tickets. Military veterans receive half off any \$40 and \$50 seat, and active-duty personnel were admitted free via the **Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl** corporate military ticket underwriting program. A portion of local ticket sales will go to designated military charities.

2009 BELL HELICOPTER ARMED FORCES BOWL – The “third time was the charm” for the United States Air Force Academy as the Falcons scored a 47-20 win over the University of Houston in the **2009 Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl**. The Air Force had dropped its previous two **Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl** appearances, including a 34-28 decision to Houston in the 2008 game at Amon G. Carter Stadium. The Falcons dropped their first bowl game in Fort Worth as Cal posted a 42-36 win in 2007. Houston is now 1-2 in the **Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl** after losing 42-13 to Kansas in the 2005 game. The **2009 Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl** featured the top passing team in the country against the school with the best defense against the pass as the 2009 New Year’s Eve game was a bowl rematch for only the seventh-time in the history of collegiate football bowl competition. The “pass first” Cougars of Houston met the “pass defense first” Falcons of Air Force. The December 31 kicked off at 11 a.m. (CST) game at Amon G. Carter Stadium and was aired live on ESPN. Previous bowl games with back-to-back match-ups were the **Cotton** (1970-1971, Notre Dame and Texas; 1993-1994, Notre Dame and Texas A&M), **Rose** (1973-1974-1995, USC and Ohio State), **Orange** (1990-1991, Notre Dame and Colorado; 1993-1994, Florida State and Nebraska) and the **Outback** (2001-2002, South Carolina and Ohio State). Three of the previous six match-ups featured splits with Notre Dame (Texas A&M), Florida State and South Carolina completing two-game sweeps.



BELL HELICOPTER - A Textron Inc. Company, Bell Helicopter agreed August 23, 2006 to title sponsor the post-season college football game formerly known as both the PlainsCapital Fort Worth Bowl (2003 and 2004) and the Fort Worth Bowl (2005), which is now the Armed Forces Bowl. With those changes, the official name is the **Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl**. Bell Helicopter announced the renewal of its option to sponsor the 2008 and 2009 games at a 2007 Team Announcement party (December 7, 2007). On September 9, 2009, President and CEO John Garrison announced a new agreement for **Bell Helicopter** to continue as the **Armed Forces Bowl** title sponsor through the 2011 game with a set option for two additional years for the 2012 and 2013 contests.

BELL HELICOPTER-TEXTRON is an American manufacturer of helicopters and tiltrotor aircraft, both military and commercial, headquartered in Fort Worth. Bell Helicopter provides the United States armed forces with the world’s best vertical lift aircraft, including the V-22 Osprey tiltrotor, the OH-58D Kiowa Warrior helicopter and the AH-1Z Viper and UH-1Y Venom helicopters. A sister company, Textron Systems, produces the new M1117 Armored Security Vehicle, which is designed for speed and for deflecting rocket-propelled grenades and land mines.

ESPN REGIONAL TELEVISION/EVENT OWNERSHIP - The nation’s largest syndicator of collegiate sports programming, ESPN Regional Television (ERT) annually produces more than 1,000 telecasts of sporting events. Programming includes football, basketball, NCAA events, golf and NHRA events accounting for more than 2,200 live and/or original hours of programming. In addition to event ownership, ERT is the production headquarters for ESPNU, the 24-hour college sports network; syndication rights-holder and producer of national, regional and local shows for college conferences (e.g. – SEC, BIG EAST, Big 12, Mid-American, WAC). ESPN Regional Television markets and/or owns several sporting events, including collegiate football events: the Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl (Fort Worth, Texas); MAACO Bowl Las Vegas; New Mexico Bowl (Albuquerque); Papajohns.com Bowl (Birmingham, Ala.); Sheraton Hawai’i Bowl (Honolulu); St. Petersburg Bowl; the MEAC/SWAC Challenge presented by Disney (Orlando, Fla.); and *The Home Depot ESPNU College Football Awards*; collegiate basketball events: the 76 Classic (Anaheim, Calif.); Cancun Governor’s Cup; Charleston Classic (S.C.); DIRECTV SEC/BIG EAST Invitational; ESPNU Road to the Championship (Women; San Antonio); Hawaiian Airlines Diamond Head Classic (Honolulu); Old Spice Classic (Walt Disney World Resort near Orlando, Fla.); O’Reilly Auto Parts Puerto Rico Tip-Off (San Juan); SONIC All-College Basketball Classic (Oklahoma City) and *BracketBusters*; as well as the ESPN National Golf Challenge presented by Callaway. AMON G. CARTER STADIUM - Named for the Fort Worth publisher and philanthropist, Amon G. Carter Stadium features a natural grass surface (Tiff 419 Bermuda Grass) and was built in 1929. The facility seats 44,358 and is the home for the TCU Horned Frogs, the 2002 Conference-USA co-champions and 2003 **Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl** participant. Here are the top Amon G. Greg Gadson, who lost both legs to a bomb in Iraq and has served as an inspiration for the XLII Super Bowl champions, was the featured speaker at **2008 Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl Kickoff Luncheon**. Coaching legends Spike Dykes (2003) and Barry Switzer (2005) addressed the **Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl Kickoff Luncheon** attendees along with Dallas Cowboys owner Jerry Jones in 2004. ESPN's College GameDay's Lee Corso was the 2006 keynote orator along with Lieutenant General David Petraeus. **Chad Hennings (Air Force)**, a 2006 College Football Hall of Fame inductee, headlined the 2007 event at the Texas MotorSpeedway.

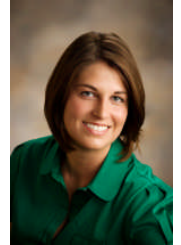
NOT THE FIRST - The 2003 **Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl** was not the first for city. The "Fort Worth Classic" was staged on New Year's Day 1921 when the promoters staged a game between TCU and the Centre College Praying Colonels, an upstart Kentucky team led by players from Fort Worth. Centre won the game 63-7. It would be another 16 years before Dallas would host the first Cotton Bowl. Fort Worth also hosted a 1940s small-college bowl game, the Cattle Bowl, on New Year's Day at LaGrave Field.

BELL HELICOPTER ARMED FORCES BOWL STAFF

Brant B. Ringler, Executive Director - A veteran sports marketer, Ringler was named July 23, 2009, as the Executive Director for the **Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl** replacing Tom Starr, who resigned in June to enter private business. Ringler, who joined the staff in November 2004 as the Manager of Sales and Marketing, set records for soliciting the number of corporate partners involved with the **Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl**, and was key to securing the Bell Helicopter title sponsorship of the game. Featured in the *Fort Worth Business Press* "40 under 40," which spotlights 40 of the area's best and brightest under the age of 40, Ringler joined the Fort Worth-based bowl after four seasons as the Vice President of Sales and Marketing for the Fort Worth Cats professional baseball team. That team was named the 2002 and 2003 Central Baseball League's Organization of the Year. A 1993 graduate of the University of Texas at Arlington with a B.A. Degree in Communications, Ringler started his sports marketing career with the Rancho Cucamonga Quakes as Sales Manager (1994-1998). Following that position, he worked as a corporate sales executive with Envision of California, where he was involved in the partnership between Fox and the Anshutz Group, with his major responsibility being a sales and marketing representative for the Los Angeles Dodgers. A native of Fort Worth, Ringler is married to the former Miquelle Penney.



Anne Rector, Supervisor, Events - Rector joined the Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl staff in May of 2008. After receiving graduating from Texas Tech University in 2001 with an advertising degree, Rector earned her MBA for the University of Dallas in 2007 with an emphasis in Sports and Entertainment Management. While in graduate school, she served an internship with the Dallas Stars Hockey Club and did project work for both the Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl and ESPN Radio. Rector joined the bowl staff after a seven-year tenure with The Wall Street Journal, where she was a top Sr. Advertising Account Supervisor. Among other activities, Rector was a Raider Recruiter for the athletic department at Texas Tech, helping to recruit prospective student-athletes as well as fundraising for both the Mike Leach Open Golf Tournament and the Spike Dikes Open Golf Tournament. In addition, she was a member of the "Goin' Band from Raiderland". She is a member of the Sigma Iota Epsilon Honor Fraternity and has served as a mentor for Big Brothers/Big Sisters of Dallas. A former recipient of the Girl Scout Gold Award, the Lubbock natives now lives in north Fort Worth with her husband, Jerad.



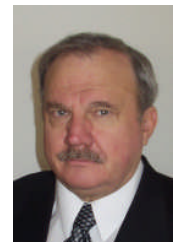
Hope Lockett, Supervisor, Sales and Marketing - Lockett was named to the **Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl** stop in September of 2009. Her primary role will be to work directly with corporate sponsors and marketing partners on a daily basis for the **Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl**. Prior to joining the bowl staff, Lockett served 16 months as the associate director for the Fort Worth-based Davey O'Brien Foundation where she managed ticket sales and sponsorship renewals for the annual awards dinner. She also managed the high school scholarship applications and selection process for the Davey O'Brien Foundation while overseeing the Hall of Fame and Web site appearance. A native of Austin, Texas, Lockett is a 2008 graduate of Texas Christian University with a bachelor of business administration degree in marketing. A member of the Delta Delta Delta sorority, Lockett was a TCU Dean's Scholarship recipient and was on the Dean's List.



Trisha Branch, Ticket Manager - Branch became the first-ever Ticket Manager of the Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl when she assumed those duties on September 1, 2003. In her role of overseeing all aspects of the bowl's ticket operation, she is responsible for all sales to the public; team allotment tickets for the two universities selected to play in the game; tickets involving promotional campaigns; will call tickets; and handling the seating for all military personnel. In addition to her ticket duties, she assists other staff members on projects ranging from marketing to promotions and is also in charge of running the offices and handling all clerical matters. Prior to joining the bowl, Branch worked at the Makens Real Estate Company. She worked in sales and was associated with the commercial real estate field for four years. Before that, she was a full-time "mom" for 15 years before returning to the work force. Trisha, who attended Eastern Hills High School and the University of Texas at Arlington, has three daughters, Katy, Macy, and Lesley.



Tim Simmons, Media Operations Director - Simmons has coordinated the media operations for the Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl since April, 2003. An independent event service consultant specializing in the distribution of media information at sporting and special events, Simmons worked 11 years in sports marketing at the Coors Brewing Company. Involved with the distribution of information for Beach Volleyball at the past three Summer Olympic Games in Atlanta, Sydney and Athens, Simmons is currently a Press Delegate for the international Volleyball Federation for the SWATCH-FIVB World Tour. During a 16-year span starting in the late 1960's, Simmons served as athletic publicist at the University of Colorado; the Big Sky Conference; the Denver Nuggets; Colorado State University; and the University of Iowa. A classmate of Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl Executive Director Tom Starr, Simmons earned a Master's Degree from the University of Iowa in 1971. Previously, he had received a Bachelor's Degree from Colorado State University at Pueblo. Tim is married to the former Lynn Schoen, and they reside in Longmont, Colorado.



Adam Powers - Part of the ESPN "We Employ Work Experience", Powers joined the **Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl** staff in August 2008 and currently assists the bowl staff with event planning, marketing and ticket sales. A senior at TCU, Powers is majoring in Communication Studies with a minor in Business. Nicknamed "Austin", Powers is a member of the Lambda Chi Alpha Fraternity and is active in charitable activities for his Chapter. Powers was a founding member of the TCU Rangers, a group of campus leaders formed by the TCU Athletic department to foster enthusiasm and loyalty for the football program. He was also a member of the TCU football team during the 2006 season when the Horned Frogs earned a berth in the Poinsettia Bowl. 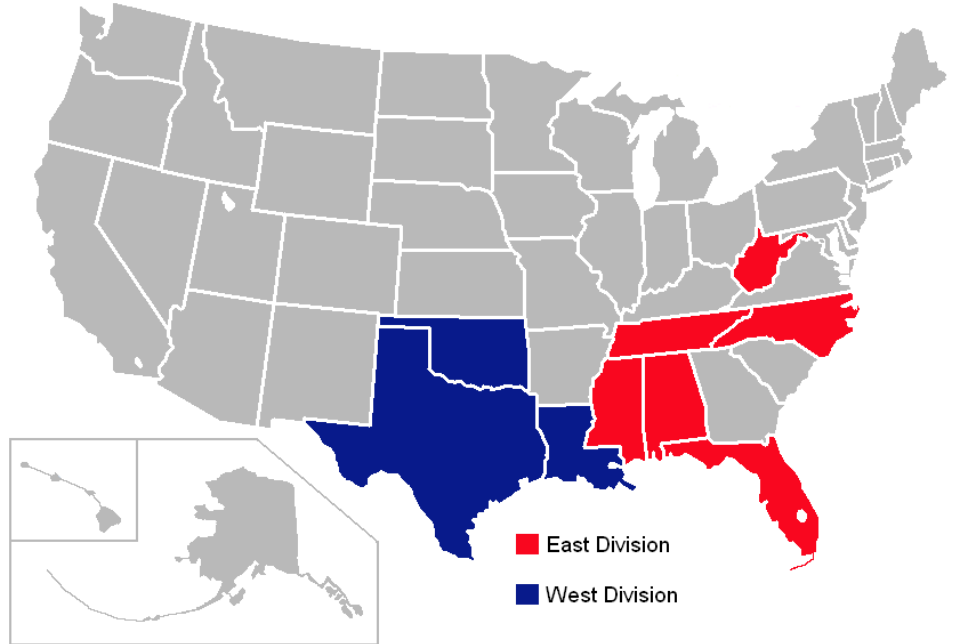

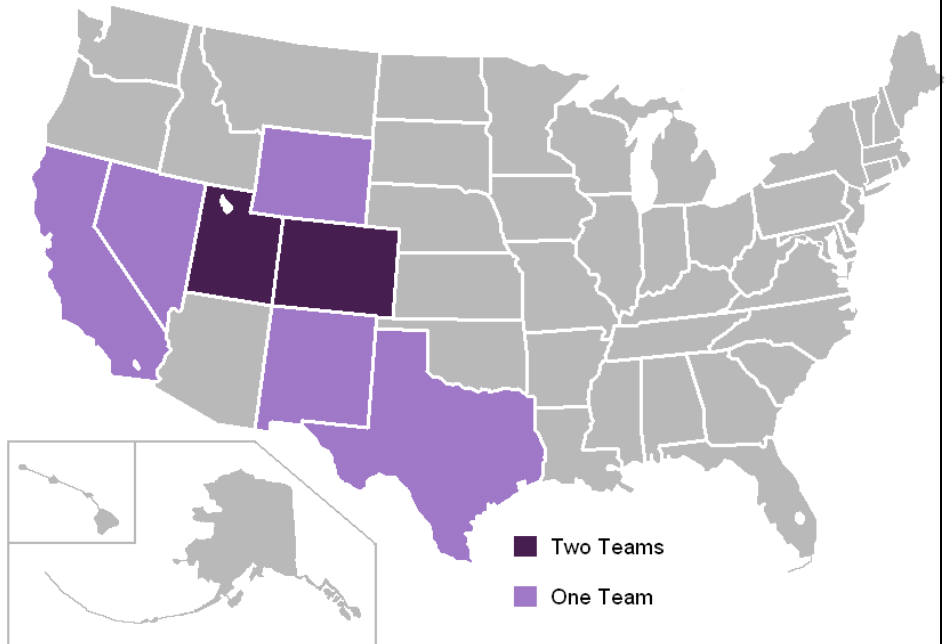

POLL EXPLANATION & ABOUT THE BCS:

The Harris Interactive Poll, USA Today Coaches Poll and computer rankings each comprise one-third of the BCS Standings. To derive the three percentages, each team is assigned an inverse point total (25 for No. 1, 24 for No. 2, etc.) The two poll percentages are calculated by dividing each team's point total by a maximum 2850 possible points (Harris) and 1475 possible points (USA Today). The computer rankings percentage is calculated by dropping the highest and lowest ranking for each team and then dividing the remaining total by 100 (the maximum possible points). The BCS Average is calculated by averaging the percentage totals of the Harris Interactive Poll, USA Today Poll, and computer rankings. The teams' BCS Averages are ranked to produce the BCS Standings. The six computer ranking providers are Anderson & Hester, Richard Billingsley, Colley Matrix, Kenneth Massey, Jeff Sagarin and Peter Wolfe. Each computer ranking provider accounts for schedule strength within its formula.

The BCS is a five-game arrangement for post-season college football that is managed by the 11 Football Bowl Subdivision (formerly Division I-A) conferences and institutions. Its purpose is to match the top two teams in a bowl game and to create exciting matchups in four other games.

The No. 1 and No. 2 teams in the Dec. 6 BCS standings will play in the Citi BCS National Championship on Jan. 7, 2010 in Pasadena, Calif. The winner of the game will be presented the Coaches Trophy, emblematic of the national championship. For more information, visit www.bcsfootball.org.

AMON G. CARTER STADIUM

Amon G. Carter Stadium & W.A. "Monty & Tex" Moncrief Field - Named for the Fort Worth Star-Telegram publisher and philanthropist, Amon G. Carter Stadium features a natural grass surface (Tiff 419 Bermuda Grass) and was built in 1929. The field gained a name in 2003, as it commemorates W.A. "Monty & Tex" Moncrief. The facility seats 44,008 and serves as the home of the TCU Horned Frogs of the Mountain West Conference.

- **1929 Constructed** - Amon G. Carter Stadium, with a seating capacity of 22,000, is built to replace old Clark Field.
- **1930 Dedication** - TCU posts a 40-0 win over Arkansas in the October 11 to conclude the formal dedication of the stadium.
- **1948 Television** - The first documented telecast of a football game in Amon G. Carter Stadium takes place October 2 as Arkansas defeats TCU 27-14.
- **1948 Expansion** - Minor expansions of the stadium's end zone and east seating raises the total by 8,500 to a capacity of 30,500.
- **1951 Expansion** - Further expansion of the stadium's end zone and east side seating increases the capacity to over 33,000.
- **1953 Expansion** - Phase III of Amon G. Carter Stadium's end zone and east side seating expansion increases capacity to over 37,000.
- **1956 Upper Deck** - The stadium's most recent expansion, the upper deck on the west side, is erected, adding 9,000 seats to the facility. The capacity was 46,000.
- **1956 Press Box** - The present-day, multipurpose press box, towering over the west stands and some 18 stories above the stadium floor is built. This two-level facility is fully carpeted and can accommodate more than 200 members of the media. The structure stretches from one 15-yard line to the other.
- **1973 Synthetic Turf** - The University installs the first in a series of three synthetic playing surfaces.
- **1983 New Lighting** - A new stadium lighting system is installed. Eleven racks of light towers with a total of 356 metal halide lamp fixtures, rated at 1500 watts each, are put into place. The renovation, yielding an average of 125 to 130-foot candles of illumination on the playing surface increased the stadium's previous lighting system by more than 600 percent. Television camera platforms are also installed below the front edge of the west stands.
- **1984 Single-game Attendance Mark** - The stadium's all-time attendance record of 47,280 is established on November 17 as Texas defeats TCU 44-23 in a Southwest Conference contest.
- **1985 New Seating** - Seating areas in the lower decks on the stadium's east and west sides are replaced with aluminum seats.
- **1991 Sound System** - The stadium's public address system is replaced with an extensive, state-of-the-art sound system. That summer also saw the upper-deck undergo a major facelift, as both the wooden bleachers and the fiberglass chair back seats were replaced with aluminum seating.
- **1992 Return to Grass** - For the first time since 1973, a natural grass playing surface is installed in the summer. The natural surfacea TIFF 419 varietyreplaced the latest in a series of artificial surfaces. The estimated price for the summer-long project was \$575,000.
- **1992 Message Center** - The summer of '92 also saw the installation of an attractive electronic scoreboard/message center in the stadium's north end zone, as well as an auxiliary scoreboard in the southwest corner of the west stands.
- **2002 Videoboard** - Thanks to a gift from the David E. Bloxom, Sr. Foundation, a new state-of-the art, football scoring and video system was added beyond the north end zone.
- **2003 Field Name** - The field gained a name in 2003, as it commemorates W.A. "Monty and Tex" Moncrief.
- **2007-2008 Upgrades** - Following the completion of the \$7 million Sam Baugh Indoor Practice Facility in 2007, the \$13 million, 40,000 square-foot Dutch Meyer Athletic Complex and Abe Martin Academic Enhancement Center was opened in the fall of 2008 featuring academic and team meeting space, a team community area, 250 club seats, six luxury suites and a unique view of Amon G. Carter Stadium.

COLLEGE FOOTBALL AWARDS

Davey O'Brien Award - The 33rd Annual Davey O'Brien Awards Dinner will be February 15, 2010 at The Fort Worth Club. The National Selection Committee, made up of a nationwide panel of sportswriters, commentators and former O'Brien Award Winners, in conjunction with the O'Brien Fan Vote, named Texas's **Colt McCoy** as the 2009 recipient. Case Keenum from Houston was a semi-finalist for the 2009 award. The Davey O'Brien Foundation was established in 1977 to present the O'Brien Memorial Trophy, recognizing annually the outstanding college football player in the five southwestern states of Texas, Louisiana, Arkansas, Oklahoma and New Mexico. The award was redirected in 1981 to be national in scope, but limited to the quarterback position. O'Brien led the TCU Horned Frogs to the 1938 National Championship and was the first player to win the Heisman, Walter Camp and Maxwell Awards in one season. A high school scholarship program began in 1986, awarding annually a \$20,000 college scholarship to an outstanding senior student-athlete in the Dallas/Fort Worth Metroplex. **Bryan Bailey** (Trinity High School, Euless), who attended the Air Force Academy, won the 1996 award. Since 1977 the Davey O'Brien Foundation has awarded over \$770,000 in scholarships and university grants to help high school and college athletes transform leadership on the field to leadership in life.
