### BOWL NOTES

**THE GAME . . .** The **TULSA GOLDEN HURRICANE** (8-4, 7-1 C-USA) will be making its 18th bowl appearance in school history and seventh in last nine years when the Hurricane plays the **BYU COUGARS** (9-3) in the 2011 Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl . . . kickoff time is 11:00 am (CT) at Gerald J. Ford Stadium (32,000) in Dallas, Texas on the campus of SMU . . . the game will be aired on ESPN and ESPN Radio.

**TULSA MAKES 18th BOWL GAME . . .** Tulsa will be playing in its 18th bowl game in school history this season and first against the BYU Cougars. The Hurricane has an overall 8-9 record in bowl games.



It's the second time that Tulsa will be playing in the Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl . . . the previous appearance also came against a school from the state of Utah — the Utah Utes in the 2006 game. Utah captured a 25-13 victory.

Tulsa was the first school to play in five straight New Year's Day Bowl games since the 1940s. Tulsa played in the Sun Bowl on Jan. 1, 1942, Sugar Bowl on Jan. 1, 1943, Sugar Bowl on Jan. 1, 1944, Orange Bowl on Jan. 1, 1945 and the Oil Bowl on Jan. 1, 1946.

**THE SERIES . . .** This is the eighth meeting between Tulsa and BYU . . . the Cougars lead the series 6-1 . . . the Cougars lead 4-0 in home games and have a 2-1 edge in road games . . . the first meeting came in 1971 when BYU captured a 27-7 victory in Tulsa . . . Tulsa's lone win was in the last meeting when the Hurricane defeated visiting BYU, 55-47, on Sept. 15, 2007 . . . the two schools have combined to average 73.3 points a contest in the seven meetings.

**TULSA MAKING SEVENTH BOWL GAME IN LAST NINE YEARS . . .** This is the seventh bowl game in the past nine years for the Tulsa Golden Hurricane . . . the Hurricane has posted a 4-2 record in its last six bowl games, including winning its last three contests.

In Tulsa's three consecutive victories, the Hurricane has averaged 56.7 points per game and allowed 18.3 points in those games. Last year, Tulsa captured a 62-35 victory over #24 Hawai'i in the Sheraton Hawai'i Bowl on December 24, 2010.

Tulsa also posted a 45-13 win over #22 Ball State in the GMAC Bowl on January 6, 2009, and the year before, Tulsa defeated Bowling Green 63-7 in the GMAC Bowl. The 56-point difference in the Bowling Green game was an NCAA record for the largest margin of victory in a bowl game.

The other two bowl appearances for the Hurricane in the last nine years came in the 2003 Humanitarian Bowl, a 52-10 loss to Georgia Tech, and the 2005 AutoZone Liberty Bowl victory, 31-24, over Fresno State.

**THE HEAD COACHES . . .** Tulsa's **BILL BLANKENSHIP** (Tulsa '79) is in his first season as the Golden Hurricane head coach . . . he collected his first career collegiate head coaching win with a 31-3 win at Tulane on Sept. 10th, and is 8-4 on the year and is only the seventh head coach in Tulsa history to win eight or more games in his first season . . . Blankenship was promoted as Tulsa's 28th Head Football Coach on January 14, 2011 . . . he spent the previous four years as a Tulsa assistant coach . . . Blankenship returned to his alma mater in January 2007 to coach the wide receivers . . . in 2008, Blankenship was named special teams coordinator and in 2009 added the responsibilities of running backs coach . . . in 2010, he served as senior associate head coach, running backs coach and special teams coordinator.

Before entering the collegiate coaching ranks, Blankenship spent 23 years as an Oklahoma High School coach . . . Blankenship resigned as the head football coach at Tulsa's Union High School in December 2005 after leading his team to a second consecutive state championship at the Oklahoma Class 6A school.

As a head coach on the prep level, Blankenship compiled a 205-68 record, including an average of 10 wins per season for his last 20 years, appeared in the state championship game eight times and won three state titles.

He spent 14 years as the head football coach and athletic director at Union High School, where he registered a record of 154-26 . . . his teams qualified for the state playoffs 14 times, reached the quarterfinals 10 times and made the semifinals in nine seasons . . . Blankenship's teams made the state title game seven times . . . he guided his Union team to Oklahoma Class 6A state titles in 2002, 2004 and 2005.

BYU's **BRONCO MENDENHALL** (Oregon State '88) is in his seventh season at the helm of the Cougar football program . . . he has compiled a 65-24 record with the Cougars . . . his .730 winning percentage currently ranks 8th among active BCS coaches . . . Mendenhall has now taken his teams to seven straight bowl games and has won two outright Mountain West Conference championships . . . he is the only coach in BYU history to take his first seven teams to a bowl game . . . before taking over the reigns as head coach, Mendenhall spent two years (2003-04) as the Cougars' defensive coordinator . . . before that, he spent five seasons (1998-2002) as the defensive coordinator at New Mexico . . . he also coached at Louisiana Tech (1997), Oregon State (1995-96), Northern Arizona (1992-94) and Snow College (1991-92) . . . he began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at his alma mater in 1989.

**TULSA FINISHES CONFERENCE USA SLATE WITH 7-1 RECORD . . .** The Hurricane opened the Conference USA schedule in the second week of the season with a 31-3 road win at Tulane on Sept. 10 . . . after three non-conference games, Tulsa jumped back into C-USA action on Oct. 15 against UAB with a 37-20 victory . . . the Hurricane followed that with wins at Rice (38-20), home vs. SMU (38-7), at UCF (24-17), home against Marshall (59-17) and at UTEP (57-28) . . . it was the first 7-0 start for the Hurricane in C-USA play since joining the league in 2005 . . . Tulsa got its first blemish in league action Nov. 25 against Houston, 48-16 . . . since joining C-USA, Tulsa has a 39-16 regular season record and has played in three C-USA Championship games . . . the Hurricane has now won at least six C-USA games in five of seven seasons as a league member.

## TULSA'S FOUR LOSSES COME TO TOP-10 TEAMS . . .

Tulsa faced four *Associated Press* top-10 nationally-ranked teams when the teams met on the field this year — #1 Oklahoma, #8 Oklahoma State, #4 Boise State and #8 Houston . . . never before had Tulsa faced four top-25 teams, let alone top-10 teams in the same season . . . the Hurricane has played three top-25 teams in the same season only two other times in school history, but never three teams ranked among the top-10 like this year . . . the only other times that Tulsa played three top-25 teams in school history came in 1945 — Tulsa played #8 Indiana, #11 Oklahoma State and #18 Georgia — and two years ago, when Tulsa played #12 Oklahoma, #5 Boise State and #13 Houston in the 2009 campaign.

## FITZPATRICK BECOMES SCHOOL'S ALL-TIME SCORING LEADER . . .

Senior placekicker Kevin Fitzpatrick (Jensen Beach, Fla.) has scored 296 career points in 47 games for a 6.3 average per game to become the school's all-time scoring leader . . . three of the top-4 scorers in school history have come consecutively in the last 10 years beginning with Brad DeVault (2002-05), Jarod Tracy (2004-08) and now Fitzpatrick (2008-present) . . . Fitzpatrick surpasses Tracy (286), Jason Staurovsky's (1981, '83-85) 281 points and DeVault (280).

## ARNICK IS NATION'S SIXTH-LEADING TACKLER AND THIRD FOR SOLO TACKLES . . .

Senior linebacker Curnelius Arnick has totaled 142 tackles in 12 games this year for an average of 11.8 tackles per game to rank sixth in NCAA stats . . . he is third in solos stops nationally with an average of 7.58 solo tackles . . . Boston College's Luke Kuechly leads the nation in total tackles (15.9) and solo stops (8.5) in 12 games . . . Arnick has 91 solos and 51 assisted tackles . . . Arnick has had seven double-digit tackle games this year, including a career-best of 19 tackles at UCF . . . he added 18 tackles against both No.1 Oklahoma and No. 4 Boise State . . . Arnick also totaled 14 tackles at UTEP, 12 at Rice, 11 stops against No. 7/8 Oklahoma State and 10 tackles against UAB . . . Arnick now has 339 career tackles to rank sixth on the school's career tackles chart . . . he now has 15 career double-figure tackle games.

## TULSA IMPROVES TO 18-6 ALL-TIME AGAINST C-USA EAST DIVISION FOES . . .

With a 59-17 win over Marshall, Tulsa finished out its schedule against Conference USA East Division members with a 3-0 record . . . the Hurricane also had wins over UAB (37-20) and UCF (24-17) . . . in its seventh season as a C-USA member, Tulsa has posted an overall 18-6 record against C-USA East Division foes, including 17-4 in the regular season and 1-2 in the league's title game . . . the Hurricane won its first nine games against Eastern Division opponents . . . Tulsa was 7-0 in its first two seasons in the league against the East . . . the Hurricane is 11-2 at home and 7-4 on the road against the East Division . . . Tulsa's first loss against the East Division came against UCF on Oct. 20, 2007.

## WALKER WAS ONE OF HENDRICKS AWARDS FINAL 19 SELECTIONS . . .

Tulsa senior defensive end Tyrunn Walker (New Iberia, La.) was named to the Ted Hendricks Final Watch List of 19 players for the award honoring the nation's top defensive end . . . Walker has tallied 37 tackles, and team-bests of 12.5 stops for -72 yards and 8 sacks for -57 yards, as well as seven pass breakups and two forced fumbles . . . in his two-year career, Walker has compiled 24.5 stops for -139 yards and 13.5 sacks for -98 yards, while tallying 80 total tackles.

## TULSA SCORING IN THE LEAGUE . . .

Tulsa scored over 30 points in six of eight Conference USA games this year and had an average winning margin in those six contests of 25.7 points . . . the Hurricane averaged 40.5 points (284), while giving up just 16.0 points (112) for a 24.5 winning margin in its seven C-USA victories.

**WATTS GOES FOR 94 YARDS ON KO RETURN . . .** Sophomore Trey Watts (Fairfax, Va.) had Tulsa's first kickoff return for a touchdown this year and the first since Nov. 6, 2010, when he raced 94 yards against UTEP to put the Hurricane ahead 29-15 with 2:45 remaining before halftime . . . the run ties for the 13th-longest KO return in school history . . . Tulsa has had four 100-yard returns, six 98-yard returns, two 96-yard returns and now with Watts' return has five 94-yard returns in school history . . . Watts also ended the game with a career-best 254 all-purpose yards for his third 200+ all-purpose yard game of the season . . . he had 113 yards on kickoffs, 69 rushing and 72 receiving against the Miners.

**KINNE SURPASSES 9,000 CAREER PASSING YARDS . . .** In three seasons, Tulsa senior quarterback G.J. Kinne (Gilmer, Texas) has already surpassed the 10,000-yard plateau for total offense (10,617), a feat he accomplished in his 35th game against Marshall . . . he became just the third Tulsa quarterback to surpass 9,000 yards when he totaled 352 yards against Rice, and just the second Tulsa player to go over 10,000 yards . . . against UTEP, Kinne surpassed the 9,000-yard career passing mark and now has 9,258 career passing yards to rank third on the school's all-time passing chart.

**KINNE'S 78 TOUCHDOWN PASSES MOVES HIM INTO SECOND PLACE ON SCHOOL CHART . . .** Senior quarterback G.J. Kinne ranks second in school history for career passing touchdowns with 78 TD passes, an average of 2.1 touchdowns in his 37 career games played . . . he trails all-time leader Paul Smith (2003-07) by five touchdown passes in 11 less games than Smith had played . . . Smith threw for 83 TDs in 48 career games, an average of 1.7 touchdowns per game.

**OVER 50 AND 600 . . .** Tulsa put up 50+ points and 600+ yards for the first time this season in a 59-17 win over Marshall . . . a week later, Tulsa had 57 points and 500 yards at UTEP . . . in the last five seasons, Tulsa has gone over 500 yards 36 times, while also surpassing 40 points in 29 contests . . . in that time span, Tulsa has totaled 500+ yards and scored 40+ points in the same game 25 times now, posting a 22-3 record in those games . . . Tulsa has scored over 50 points in 16 games over the last five campaigns.

**TULSA OFFENSE PUTS UP NUMBERS AGAINST TOP DEFENSE . . .** Tulsa went up against one of the nation's top defensive units when facing UCF on Nov. 3 . . . the Knights came into the contest ranked in the top-5 nationally for total defense (3rd), passing defense (5th), scoring defense (5th) and rushing defense (5th) . . . the Hurricane surpassed the offensive totals that UCF had allowed in its first eight games . . . below is a breakdown of the numbers:

**WALKER MAKES BIG PLAYS IN WIN VS. UCF . . .** Senior defensive end Tyrunn Walker (New Iberia, La.) has been consistent for the Hurricane all season . . . against UCF, Walker made two huge defensive plays that helped the Hurricane capture a 24-17 road victory . . . just before the half, UCF was trying to increase its' lead from 14-13 to 17-13 when Walker blocked a 46-yard field goal attempt with no time remaining . . . late in the game with 4:54 remaining on the clock and UCF trailing 24-17, Walker ran down UCF quarterback Jeff Godfrey and had him in his arms forcing a poor pass on 4th-and-goal from the four-yard line, thus giving the Hurricane offense the ball to run out the clock.

## TULSA LEADS C-USA TITLES RACE WITH 36 LEAGUE CROWNS . . .

Since the new Conference USA was formed and began competition in the 2005-06 season, Tulsa athletic teams have won a league-best 36 Conference USA Championships, including regular season and post-season tournament titles. The next closest since 2005 is Houston and Rice with 20 C-USA titles apiece. The Golden Hurricane won its first C-USA crown this year when the Men's Cross Country team claimed the title, while the women's volleyball team clinched its second straight league title this year as well.

**BIG THIRD DOWNS TO SAVE VICTORY . . .** With a 24-17 lead at UCF, Tulsa took possession at their own four-yard line with 4:54 remaining in the game and a 24-17 lead . . . the Hurricane converted two big first downs to keep the drive alive and eventually run out the clock . . . on 3rd-and-3 from the Tulsa 11-yard line, Trey Watts (Fairfax, Va.) ran seven yards for a first down at the Tulsa 18 . . . on the next third down situation, 3rd-and-7 at the 21-yard line, Alex Singleton (LaPlace, La.) rushed 17 yards to the Tulsa 38-yard line for its second first down of the drive . . . Tulsa then ran out the clock in three plays.

**KINNE ONLY SECOND TU PLAYER TO SURPASS 10,000 TOTAL OFFENSE YARDS . . .** Senior quarterback G.J. Kinne (Gilmer, Texas) surpassed 10,000 career yards against Marshall when he gained 321 total yards . . . he hit 10,000 on the nose when he threw a 28-yard pass to Nathan Largen at the 2:01 mark of the second quarter against the Herd . . . Kinne now has 10,617 career yards of total offense, becoming just the second Tulsa player to reach the 10,000-yard plateau . . . he trails all-time leader Paul Smith (2003-07) by 985 yards.

**DOUGLAS ON THE RUN . . .** Sophomore tailback Ja'Terian Douglas (Arlington, Texas) gained 19.4 yards per carry against Marshall when he totaled a career-best 194 yards on 10 carries . . . Douglas had a run of 82 yards, the longest run from scrimmage on the Tulsa team this year . . . he also had runs for 48 and 22 yards against Marshall . . . on the year, Douglas has eight carries for 20+ yards . . . his 194 yards was the most since Tarrion Adams rushed for 207 yards against Ball State in the GMAC Bowl following the 2008 season . . . Douglas' 194 yards ties for the 24th most rushing yards in school history.

## BEST RECORD OVER THE LAST FIVE YEARS . . . Tulsa is one of only 11 schools with double-digit wins in three out of the last four years.

**SCORING QUICKLY . . .** Ten times this season, the Tulsa offense has had a scoring drive under 48 seconds . . . it happened three times against Marshall, as Tulsa's first drive covered 0:30 in two plays and 52 yards . . . Tulsa's sixth TD came in just 0:05, while Tulsa's final touchdown came in 0:38 . . . other sub 0:48 drives this season include —vs. OSU (0:11, 0:07, 0:34), UAB (0:23, 0:48) Rice (0:16) and SMU (0:39).

**ARNICK HITS 300, McCOIL SURPASSES 200 FOR CAREER TACKLES . . .** Two Tulsa defenders reached landmarks when it came to career tackles in the UCF game . . . senior Cornelius Arnick (Dallas, Texas) surpassed the 300-tackle plateau with 19 stops at UCF . . . he now has 339 career stops to rank sixth on the school's all-time tackles chart . . . with four stops against UCF, junior safety Dexter McCoil (Lutcher, La.) went over 200 tackles in his three-year career and now has 216 career stops in 36 games.

**TULSA'S 12-GAME C-USA WINNING STREAK SNAPPED AGAINST HOUSTON . . .** Dating back to last year's 52-24 home victory against Tulane on October 16, Tulsa had won 12 straight Conference USA games until a 48-16 loss to Houston in the regular season finale . . . the Hurricane finished out the 2010 campaign with wins against Tulane, Rice, Houston, UTEP and Southern Miss . . . this season, Tulsa claimed league victories over Tulane, UAB, Rice, SMU, UCF, Marshall and UTEP before suffering the Houston loss . . . the Hurricane was 7-0 at home and 5-0 on the road during this streak, including 3-0 both at home and on the road this season . . . Tulsa's 12-game streak is the third-longest in C-USA history behind Southern Miss' streaks of 13 and 14 wins on two separate occasions.

**BURNHAM BURSTS ONTO THE SCENE IN 2011 . . .** In 2008, Bryan Burnham (Moorestown, NJ) sat out his true freshman season . . . in 2009, he played in the defensive secondary and saw action in one game . . . in 2010, Burnham made the move to receiver in the fall and played solely on special teams . . . now in 2011, that move to the wide-out position has paid dividends for Burnham and the Hurricane.

On the year, Burnham has gained 737 receiving yards on 50 receptions for a 14.7 average and has a team-best eight touchdowns.

In his first career start, Burnham had a 56-yard reception against No. 1 Oklahoma . . . a week later, Burnham caught seven passes for 94 yards and two touchdowns at Tulane . . . against No. 7/8 Oklahoma State, Burnham caught three passes for 68 yards and another two TDs . . . Burnham had 101 yards and one TD on six receptions against North Texas, while he surpassed that total with a career-best 146 yards and one TD on 10 catches against Marshall.

**SEARS GETS MOST YARDS FOR TE SINCE 2005 . . .** Senior tight end Clay Sears (Fredericksburg, Texas) had a career-best 105 receiving yards and two TDs on nine receptions against UAB . . . it was the first time that a Tulsa tight end had a 100+ yard receiving game since Garrett Mills on Dec. 3, 2005 in the C-USA Championship game victory over UCF . . . Sears came into the game with 112 yards in the first five games, and a career total of 265 yards on 20 receptions.

This season, Sears now has 35 receptions for 438 yards and six TDs . . . he has totaled 46 catches for 579 yards and eight TDs in his career . . . he had the game-winning 16-yard TD reception at UCF . . . in addition to his two TD catches against UAB, he also caught two TDs against Marshall.

His 438-yard total this year is the most for a Tulsa tight end since Garrett Mills had 1,235 receiving yards in the 2005 season.

**KINNE IS THE ONLY ONE IN SCHOOL HISTORY TO PASS FOR 6,000 AND RUN FOR 1,000 . . .** With 46 rushing yards in the season opener at Oklahoma, quarterback G.J. Kinne (Gilmer, Texas) hit the 1,000-yard rushing plateau for his career . . . he is the only quarterback in school history to pass for over 6,000 yards and rush for 1,000 yards . . . Kinne currently has 9,258 passing yards and 1,359 rushing yards in his three seasons . . . the last Tulsa quarterback to rush for over 1,000 yards was James Kilian (2001-04) with 1,083 rushing yards, but Kilian had 4,865 passing yards . . . the most rushing yards for any Tulsa quarterback was Steve Gage's (1983-86) 2,096 yards.

**CARTER GOES FOR CAREER-HIGH IN BACK TO BACK GAMES . . .** Junior H-back Willie Carter (Crockett, Texas), who played behind current Miami Dolphins rookie Charles Clay the last two seasons, has had two 100+ receiving games this year . . . he had a career-best 160 yards on nine receptions at Rice and a week later bettered that with 173 yards on 13 catches vs. SMU . . . he had his first 100+ receiving game with 135 yards on five receptions in the season opener at No. 1 Oklahoma.

Carter's previous career-best came last year against Southern Miss when he caught four passes for 93 yards . . . Carter had receptions for 69 and 44 yards against Oklahoma, had a 64-yard touchdown reception at Rice and a 40-yard TD against SMU.

This year, Carter leads the team in receiving with 868 yards and seven TDs on 61 receptions, while rushing for 62 yards, two TDs and a 4.8 average per carry.

**DOUBLE TROUBLE AT TAILBACK . . .** The Tulsa Golden Hurricane has had a double-headed monster at tailback this season in the likes of sophomores Ja'Terian Douglas (Arlington, Texas) and Trey Watts (Fairfax, Va.).

This year, the duo has combined to rush for 1,727 yards and seven TDs, as Douglas leads the way with 884 yards and Watts has totaled 843 rushing yards.

In the third game of the season, Tulsa rolled up 365 rushing yards against No. 7/8 Oklahoma State with all but 33 of those yards coming from Tulsa's two sophomore running backs . . . Douglas and Watts combined for 332 yards and a 9.4 average per rush against the Cowboys defense . . . Douglas had a career-best 173 yards and two touchdowns on 12 carries for a 14.4 average per carry, while Watts had 159 yards and a 6.9 average per rush on 23 carries . . . Douglas' two touchdown runs went for 80 and 42 yards.

The duo was the first pair of Tulsa running backs to each gain over 100 yards in the same game since November 11, 2006 when Tarrion Adams (116) and Courtney Tennill (109) accomplished the feat against Rice.

In each of the last two seasons, quarterback G.J. Kinne has rushed for over 100 yards in a game, but the last time a Tulsa running back hit the 100-yard plateau was Tarrion Adams in the 2008 season finale against Ball State in the GMAC Bowl with 207 yards on January 6, 2009 . . . this year, Tulsa running backs have three 100-yard rushing games — two for Douglas and one for Watts.

Since that OSU contest, Douglas has had two more 100+ rushing games, while bettering his career-best with 194 yards on 10 carries against Marshall . . . Watts missed setting a new career-high by 15 yards with 144 rushing yards and one TD against Marshall.

## DOCK AND KINNE NAMED TO C-USA FOOTBALL

**ALL-ACADEMIC TEAM . . .** A pair of Tulsa seniors, linebacker Alan Dock (Giddings, Texas) and quarterback G.J. Kinne (Gilmer, Texas), were selected to the 12-member Conference USA Football All-Academic Team . . . Dock, who graduated last May with a degree in accounting with a 3.63 grade point average, is currently working on his master's degree . . . Kinne earns All-Academic team honors for the third consecutive season . . . the exercise sports science major also graduated last spring with a 3.27 GPA and is working on his teaching certificate.

**DOUGLAS' TD's COME FROM A DISTANCE . . .** Sophomore running back Ja'Terian Douglas (Arlington, Texas) had his second 100+ rushing game this season with 137 yards and one TD against UAB . . . his first career 100+ rushing game came earlier this season with 173 yards and two TDs against #7/8-ranked Oklahoma State . . . in both of those contests, his three touchdowns came from 40+ yards — 42 and 80 yards vs. Oklahoma State and 47 yards against UAB . . . all seven of his career touchdown runs have been 15+ yards — runs of 18, 20 and 33 yards in 2010 and 37, 42, 47 and 80 yards this year . . . Douglas also had a career-best 194 yards against Marshall this year, but his 82 and 48-yard runs did not go for touchdowns.

**TULSA FACED TOUGHEST MONTH IN COLLEGE FOOTBALL DURING SEPTEMBER . . .** Tulsa played three of the *Associated Press'* preseason top-10 teams -- #1 Oklahoma, # 5 Boise State and #9 Oklahoma State — in the first four weeks of the season . . . only Arizona also played three top-10 teams in the first four games, including #3 Oregon, #7 Stanford and #9 Oklahoma State . . . by contrast, the entire Big East, Big 10 and Mountain West Conferences play one top-10 opponent among their entire league membership in the first four games.

**THREE TIMES A CHARM; SEVEN PICK SIXES IN LAST TWO YEARS . . .** Shawn Jackson's 34-yard interception return for a touchdown against UTEP was the third time this season in which the Golden Hurricane returned a pick-off for a touchdown . . . the previous ones came in the same game as Dexter McCoil had a 74-yarder and Dwight Dobbins returned one 36 yards for a touchdown against North Texas . . . in the last two years, the Hurricane has returned seven pick-offs for touchdowns — last year's pick sixes included Marco Nelson (OSU), Shawn Jackson (Notre Dame), Curnelius Arnick (Hawaii) and John Flanders (Hawaii).

**DEFENSE SETS UP THE "O" . . .** Tulsa's first 17 points at Rice came following takeaways from the Tulsa defense . . . Tulsa scored 14 points after interceptions put the Hurricane on Rice's 26 and 34-yard lines, and on Rice's third possession Tulsa recovered a fumble that resulted in a Hurricane field goal . . . against North Texas, the Hurricane scored four offensive TDs and had two defensive scores . . . the two defensive TDs came on a 36-yard interception return by freshman Dwight Dobbins (Midwest City, Okla.) and a 74-yard return by Dexter McCoil (Lutcher, La.).

**DEFENSE STANDS UP AGAINST THE RUN THROUGHOUT THE SEASON . . .** Since giving up 246 yards rushing for a 5.3 yard average in the season opener against the #1-ranked Oklahoma Sooners, the Tulsa defense has allowed just 1,260 yards for a 126-yard average per game and a 3.2-yard average per carry (389) over the last 11 contests . . . Tulsa has held four opponents under 100 yards — 59 yards for a 1.6 average per carry by Tulane, 81 yards for a 3.0-yard average per rush by UAB, 85 yards for a 3.1 average by SMU and 84 yards for a 2.5 average by Houston — while holding Oklahoma State to a 3.6 average, 2.9 average by Boise State, 2.3-yard average per carry by North Texas and a 2.9-yard average by Rice . . . overall on the season, Tulsa's defense is giving up 131.3 rushing yards for an average of 3.4 yards per carry.

## **DOBBINS, McCOIL GET DEFENSIVE POINTS IN SAME GAME**

. . . In Tulsa's 41-24 victory over North Texas, true freshman cornerback in his first career start intercepted a pass and took it 36 yards for a Tulsa score in the first quarter . . . early in the third quarter, junior safety Dexter McCoil raced 74 yards after his interception to give the Hurricane another defensive touchdown . . . it marked the second time in the last six games, dating back to last year's Sheraton Hawaii Bowl victory over Hawaii, that two Tulsa players returned interceptions for TDs in the same game.

**ROSE, BROWN RETURN TO TULSA ROSTER . . .** Against North Texas, the Hurricane received a boost with the return of two starters to the defensive side of the ball . . . linebacker DeAndre Brown (Arlington, Texas) saw his first action against North Texas, while cornerback Lowell Rose (Los Angeles, Calif.) returned to the lineup against the Mean Green after being injured in the first quarter of the season opener, both played in reserve roles in their first game back . . . in the North Texas game, Brown had one stop for -1 yard, while Rose had three tackles . . . both players saw significant more playing time in their next game against UAB . . . Rose has been in the starting lineup in the last seven games, while Brown is a key reserve off the bench for the Hurricane defense.

**TULSA PILES UP MORE RUSHING YARDS . . .** In a stretch of three games — Tulane, #7/8 Oklahoma State and #4 Boise State — the Hurricane offense out-rushed those opponents 228.7 yards to 121.3 yards (686-364 total yards) . . . the Hurricane out-gained Tulane 166 to 59 yards . . . against Oklahoma State, the Tulsa offense piled up 365 rushing yards for a 6.2 average per carry, while the Tulsa defense held the Cowboys to 174 yards . . . then against Boise State, Tulsa out-gained the Broncos 155 to 131 yards on the ground, an average of 5.2 yards per carry for the Hurricane to 2.9 yards by Boise State.

On the year, Tulsa has gained 208.5 yards per game and 5.1 yards per carry, while the Hurricane defense has given up 135.6 rushing yards for a 3.4 average per rushing attempt.

**HEAD COACHING EXPERIENCE ABUNDANT ON THE HURRICANE SIDELINES . . .** Tulsa Head Football Coach Bill Blankenship may be in his first year as a collegiate head coach, but he had 22 years as a head coach on the prep level . . . Blankenship also has three former college head coaches on his staff — Defensive Coordinator Brent Guy, Assistant Head Coach and Offensive Line Coach Denver Johnson and Assistant Head Coach/Special Teams Coordinator and Tight Ends Coach Scott Downing . . . Guy spent four seasons (2005-08) as the head coach at Utah State . . . Johnson was a head coach for 12 seasons, spending three seasons at Murray State (1997-99) and nine years at Illinois State (2000-08) . . . he compiled an overall 69-66 record at the two schools . . . Downing served as the head coach at Northern Colorado for the past five seasons (2006-10).

**HENDERSON TAKES CONTROLS VS. #7/8 OSU . . .** Red-shirt freshman quarterback Kalen Henderson (Mount Airy, La.) saw his first collegiate playing time on a few possessions in a 31-3 win over Tulane in week two . . . but a week later against the nation's #7/8 Oklahoma State Cowboys, Henderson saw most of the action when starter G.J. Kinne went down with an injury late in the first quarter . . . in the second half, Henderson led Tulsa on four TD drives, covering 80, 43, 80 and 46 yards . . . he finished the game with six completions for 104 yards and two touchdowns.

**TULSA NOT AT FULL STRENGTH AGAINST NATION'S TOP TEAMS . . .** In playing three of the nation's top-8 teams within the first four weeks of the season — #1 Oklahoma State, #7/8 Oklahoma State and #4 Boise State, you would hope for your roster to be at full strength, but that was not the case for the Hurricane . . . Tulsa went into Oklahoma Memorial Stadium in the season opener against the No. 1-ranked Oklahoma Sooners with three starters out of the lineup for the Hurricane . . . the three players included — the NCAA's career record-holder for all-purpose yards and kickoff returns Damaris Johnson (suspension) . . . starting cornerback John Flanders (academic red-shirt), who's interception against Notre Dame last year at the end of the game clinched the victory for the Hurricane . . . starting 'Cane linebacker DeAndre Brown (injury) sat out last year, but led Tulsa in tackles in 2009 with 102 stops . . . in the first quarter against OU, Tulsa's other starting cornerback, Lowell Rose, went out of the game with an injury . . . Tulsa played 15 of the first 16 quarters this season without four of its key starters, including the three on defense — Flanders, Brown and Rose.

### **TULSA HAS 3+ DOUBLE-DIGIT TACKLERS THREE TIMES IN FIRST THREE GAMES . . .**

In two of the first three games this year, Tulsa had at least three double-digit tacklers . . . against No. 1 Oklahoma, Curnelius Arnick (Dallas, Texas) had 18 stops, 13 for Milton Howell (New Orleans, La.) and 12 for Shawn Jackson (Tulsa, Okla.) . . . the totals were also career-highs for each player.

Arnick has since broke that career-best for tackles when he tallied 19 stops against UCF.

Arnick's previous best was 12 stops against Notre Dame and Southern Miss last year . . . Howell, who played on offense and special teams last year, totaled only eight tackles last year in his first season with the Hurricane . . . Jackson had his first career double-digit tackle game at Oklahoma, while last year his high game was nine stops twice.

Against Oklahoma State, Jackson tallied 10 stops, Arnick had 11, while sophomore safety Marco Nelson (Glenpool, Okla.) had 12 tackles and junior safety Dexter McCoil (Lutcher, La.) collected 11 tackles for the Hurricane.

On the year, Tulsa players have totaled 14 double-digit tackles games, including Arnick (7), Jackson (4), and one each for Howell, McCoil and Nelson.

**CORNERS STEP UP . . .** Tulsa's defense wasn't at full depth when the Hurricane opened the season at No. 1 Oklahoma . . . with John Flanders already out for the season opener, the Hurricane played all but the first quarter without the other starting cornerback, Lowell Rose, who left the game with an injury . . . senior Milton Howell (New Orleans, La.), Flanders' replacement in the lineup, and junior Justin Skillens (Tulsa, Okla.), who filled in for Rose, have performed admirably . . . Skillens missed the North Texas game, and true freshman Dwight Dobbins received the start, while JUCO transfer J.D. Ratliff saw action . . . Rose returned to the lineup against North Texas and was back in the starting lineup a game later against UAB.

Howell had 13 stops at Oklahoma, while Skillens added seven tackles . . . both received the starts at Tulane and home against Oklahoma State in the last two games . . . against Tulane, the pair combined for six tackles, one INT and one pass break-up and had five stops against OSU.

On the year, this quartet — Howell, Skillens, Dobbins, Ratliff — has combined for 93 tackles, 14 PBUs and 5 INTs for 80 return yards . . . Howell has totaled 49 tackles, a team-leading 4 INTs and six pass break-ups, while Justin Skillens has 29 stops and one pass break-up, J.D. Ratliff has 15 tackles to go along with four pass break-ups and Dobbins has nine tackles, one INT and three pass break-ups.

**LATE GAME GETS EVEN LATER . . .** The Tulsa-Oklahoma State game scheduled for Sat., September 17th didn't actually begin until Sunday, Sept. 18th . . . the contest was scheduled for a 9:10 pm (CT) kick-off for national TV, where FSN was broadcasting to a reach of 74 million households . . . however, due to a severe storm system the start of the game was suspended at 9:03 pm, and did not kickoff until 12:16 am (CT) . . . the game ended at 3:35 am, lasting 3:19.

**TULSA'S SUCCESS IN LAST NINE YEARS . . .** The first three years of 2000's were lean for the Tulsa football, posting just a 7-28 combined record in 2000, 2001 and 2002 . . . in the last nine seasons, (including this year) Tulsa has 73 victories with a 73-43 (.629) overall record . . . the Hurricane will be appearing in its seventh Bowl games in the past nine seasons with an appearance in the Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl, posting a 4-2 record in the first six games, while winning one outright Conference USA Championship (2005), three C-USA West Division titles (2005, 2007, 2008) and sharing one West crown (2010).

### **TULSA OPENED SEASON AGAINST THE NO. 1-RANKED OKLAHOMA SOONERS . . .**

For the the fifth straight year, Tulsa opened the season on the road . . . this year the opponent was the No.1-ranked Oklahoma Sooners . . . Tulsa is now 3-2 while opening on the road the last five years following a 47-14 setback against the No. 1 Sooners.

### **TULSA'S SEVEN-GAME WINNING STREAK SNAPPED BY NO. 1. SOONERS . . .**

Tulsa entered the season with a seven-game winning streak, but that was snapped against the Oklahoma Sooners . . . the last Tulsa loss before that was a three-point loss against Co-Conference USA West Division Champion SMU on October 9, 2010 . . . Tulsa then rattled off a seven-game winning streak to close out the 2010 season with a 10-3 record . . . in those seven games, Tulsa outscored the opposition 45.9 to 30.9 points . . . Tulsa's wins in that seven-game winning streak came against Tulane, at Notre Dame, Rice, at Houston, UTEP, Southern Miss and at Hawaii.

**O-LINE HAS EXPERIENCE . . .** Eight players on Tulsa's offensive line have received starting assignments during their careers . . . all five starters from a year ago return this season as those five players combined to start 57 games in 2010.

At the start of the season, Tulsa returned the fifth-most experienced offensive line in college football, based on starting assignments with 114 starts . . . SMU led the way with 158, followed by Northwestern (137), UAB (118) and Clemson (116) ahead of the Hurricane.

Tulsa's 2011 starting offensive line — with one new starter, right tackle Matt Romine — started the first 11 games of the season until right guard Stetson Burnett suffered a season-ending injury in the 11th game of the year at UTEP . . . the current starting line has 140 starts among them . . . senior Tyler Holmes has 45 career starts at left tackle, senior guard Clint Anderson has 36 career starts, junior center Trent Dupy has started 35 games, while on the right side of the offensive line — senior transfer Matt Romine has started all 12 games this year at right tackle . . . sophomore Stetson Burnett started the first 11 games this year and had 20 career starts at right guard . . . junior guard Brian DeShane started against Houston and now has 12 career starts.

In seven of the last eight games, Tulsa's veteran offensive line has allowed just five sacks . . . the Hurricane did not allow their quarterback to get sacked against Boise State, North Texas, Rice, UCF and Houston.

In addition, seniors David Lazenby and Eric Sproal, have started seven and six games, respectively, in their careers, while junior Jared Grigg has one career start for the Hurricane.

**TULSA PICKED TO FINISH SECOND IN PRESEASON POLL . . .** The Tulsa Golden Hurricane was picked to finish in second place in the Conference USA West Division in a preseason poll of the league's media.

Tulsa edged out third-place SMU, while Houston was the preseason favorite to win the C-USA West Division . . . Tulsa and SMU tied for the West title last year with 6-2 records, but the Mustangs represented the West in the C-USA Championship Game against the UCF Knights . . . the Cougars grabbed half of the available first-place votes, while the Hurricane had eight first-place votes . . . Rice was fourth and Tulane and UTEP tied for fifth place in the C-USA West.

UCF was the overwhelming favorite to win the C-USA East Division . . . the Knights picked up 20 of 24 possible first-place votes following their 11-3 season capped with a Liberty Bowl win over Georgia . . . Southern Miss was selected second and grabbed the four remaining first-place votes . . . the Golden Eagles have made nine consecutive bowl game appearances . . . East Carolina was tabbed third, followed by Marshall, UAB and Memphis in the C-USA East.

The preseason poll, administered by the *Tulsa World*, was made up of 24 voters with each school represented by one print reporter that covers the team and one radio representative . . . Conference USA does not conduct its own poll.

**TULSA'S EXPLOSIVENESS . . .** In the last five seasons (including this year), Tulsa has gone over 500 yards in 36 of a total of 64 games, while also surpassing 40 points in 28 contests . . . in that time, Tulsa totaled 500 yards and scored 40 points in the same game 25 times, posting a 22-3 record in those contests . . . Tulsa had 500+ yards and 40+ points in six games in 2010 . . . that feat happened against East Carolina (49 points/579 yards), Central Arkansas (41 points/539 yards), Tulane (52 points/538 yards), Rice (64 points/612 yards), Southern Miss (56 points/634 yards) and Hawai'i (62 points/531 yards).

**TULSA HAS PLAYED FOR THREE CONFERENCE USA TITLES IN FIRST SIX YEARS IN THE LEAGUE . . .** Tulsa entered Conference USA as a member in all sports on July 1, 2005 . . . a little over five months later the Hurricane captured the school's first C-USA title in any sport.

Tulsa completed its first season by winning the C-USA West Division with a 6-2 league record and posting a win over UCF in the C-USA Championship Game.

In 2007, Tulsa had another 6-2 record to win the West Division and went on to face UCF in the title game once more . . . this time the Knights captured the championship game victory . . . in the 2008 campaign, after finishing 7-1 in C-USA play and winning its third West Division title, Tulsa hosted East Carolina in the Championship Game, dropping a 27-24 decision.

Tulsa has won 34 conference football titles in school history. Tulsa's C-USA crown in 2005 was the first since 1985 when the Hurricane won the Missouri Valley Conference Championship.

**A LOOK AT 2010 . . .** Tulsa finished the 2010 season with an overall 10-3 record and ranked 24th in the final AP poll . . . the Golden Hurricane was Conference USA West Division Co-Champions with a 6-2 league mark, tying SMU . . . it was a season that presented some early season adversity, but one that ended with a seven-game winning streak . . . included among those final seven wins was a dramatic 28-27 win over Notre Dame for one of the most prestigious victories in school history . . . a huge C-USA road win over rival Houston and a Sheraton Hawai'i Bowl victory over 24th-ranked Hawai'i, 62-35, closed out the 2010 season.



**TULSA HAS THREE 10-WIN SEASONS IN THE LAST FOUR YEARS . . .** The Tulsa Golden Hurricane ended the 2010 season with a 62-35 victory over 24th-ranked Hawaii to clinch a 10-3 record . . . it marked the eighth time in school history that the Hurricane has won 10 games and the third time in the last four seasons . . . Tulsa finished the 2007 campaign with a 10-4 record and the 2008 season with an 11-3 mark . . . other 10-win seasons came in 1916, 1920, 1942, 1982 and 1991.

### GAME NOTES . . .

**Vs. #1 OKLAHOMA** — Tulsa debuted its new road uniforms – gold helmet, white jersey with blue numbers and shoulders, and white pants. The helmet has a #71 decal on the back left in honor of former teammate Wilson Holloway who passed away in February 2011 after a long battle with Lymphoma Leukemia . . . G.J. Kinne (Senior/QB) and Cory Dorris (Junior/DE) started their 26th-straight games, while Tyler Holmes (Senior/OT) has started every game he has played at Tulsa (34) . . . Five players started their first game at Tulsa – WR Bryan Burnham, OT Matt Romine, WR Jordan James, DB Milton Howell and LB Alan Dock . . . in it's 112-year history, Tulsa has posted a 66-45-1 record in its' season openers . . . Bryan Burnham scored his first career touchdown on his third career catch on a 56-yard reception from G.J. Kinne with 2:54 to play in the second quarter. Burnham ended the game with a career- high 68 yards receiving . . . Curnelius Arnick (18), Milton Howell (13), Shawn Jackson (12), Justin Skillens (7) and Alan Dock (6) each had a career-high tackles. Arnick had his ninth game with double-digit tackles, while this was Howell's first game . . . the last time a TU player had 18 tackles in a game was DeAundre Brown on Oct. 14, 2009 against Boise State . . . the last time Tulsa had three tacklers register double-digit tackles was Nov. 15, 2009 against East Carolina . . . Willie Carter's 69-yard reception in the third quarter was the second longest of his career as he had a 75-yard touchdown reception against East Carolina in the 2010 season opener . . . the crowd of 85,260 fans was the most to ever watch a TU football game, breaking the record of 84,803 set back in 2009 in Norman . . . Norman native Jack Jewell played his first career game in his hometown of Norman, Oklahoma . . . Willie Carter had his first career 100-yard receiving game with 135 yards. His previous best was 93 yards against Southern Miss in 2010 . . . with his two TD passes G.J. Kinne now has 55 career TD passes.

**Vs. TULANE** — Starting their first career games were true freshman Gary Owens at receiver and junior cornerback Justin Skillens . . . senior quarterback G.J. Kinne junior defensive end Cory Dorris each made their 27th straight start . . . all seven Louisiana natives on the Tulsa travel roster saw action in the game. Those players were Kalen Henderson, Milton Howell, Jordan James, Ricky Johnson, Dexter McCoil, Alex Singleton and Tyrunn Walker . . . senior Milton Howell had his first career interception in just his second start of the season, and coming in his hometown of New Orleans . . . Alex Singleton's 46--yard run was a career-high, bettering his previous best run of 42 yards in 2010 against Central Arkansas . . . for the second straight week, junior receiver Bryan Burnham caught a touchdown pass. He finished with seven catches for 94 yards and two touchdowns, posting career highs in each category . . . Jordan James had a career-high three receptions for 70 yards in the game . . . the Golden Hurricane held Tulane to 3 points in the game. The last time TU kept an opponent out of the end zone was Sept. 26, 2009 against Sam Houston State (56-3) . . . the last time Tulsa held a Conference USA opponent without a touchdown was Nov. 24, 2006, when it defeated Tulane, 38-3, at Skelly Stadium . . . Tulsa held Tulane to 59 total rushing yards on 35 attempts. It was the fourth time in the last 15 games that TU has held an opponent to less than 100 rushing yards. The Hurricane held Hawaii to 71 yards rushing in the Sheraton Hawaii Bowl last season.

**Vs. #7/8 OKLAHOMA STATE** — Kickoff was Sunday at 12:16 a.m., due to a 3:13 minute severe weather delay. The game was originally slated for 9:10 p.m., but was delayed at 9:03 p.m . . . Tulsa faced its second nationally-ranked opponent in three games. Oklahoma State entered the game ranked #7 (USA Today) and #8 (AP). Tulsa played consensus #1 Oklahoma in the season opener . . . senior quarterback G.J. Kinne and junior defensive end Cory Dorris made their 28th consecutive starts . . . senior Kevin Fitzpatrick's 25-yard field goal at the 8:07 mark in the first quarter marks the first time in three games this season that Tulsa was the first team to score. It also marks the first time this season Tulsa scored on its opening drive . . . OSU's Justin Gilbert's 96-yard kickoff return at the 7:52 mark of the first quarter is the first time Tulsa has allowed a kickoff return for a touchdown since last season when Francisco Llanos returned an 87-yard kickoff for Southern Miss (11/26/10). It was also the longest given up by Tulsa since Kris Briggs of SMU ran back a 96-yard kickoff return for a touchdown (11/23/02) . . . senior linebacker Alan Dock registered his first career interception late with less than a minute remaining in the second half . . . sophomore Ja'Tarian Douglas' 80-yard touchdown run at the 9:27 mark in the third quarter was both the longest run from scrimmage and the longest run for a touchdown by a Tulsa player since Eric Richardson's 80-yard rushing touchdown against Louisiana Tech (11/15/03) . . . red-shirt freshman Kalen Henderson connected with junior receiver Bryan Burnham for a 43-yard touchdown at the 9:19 mark of the third quarter. It was Henderson's first career touchdown pass . . . Burnham has caught at least one touchdown pass in each of three games this season. He has also caught at least two touchdown passes in each of the last two games. He now has five total touchdowns on the season . . . sophomore running back Trey Watts set a career high for single-game all-purpose yards with 202 (159 rushing/43 kickoff return) . . . Watts set a career high

for single-game rushing with 159 yards on 23 carries. His previous high was 52 yards on 17 carries against Bowling Green (9/11/10) . . . sophomore Ja'Terian Douglas set a career high for single-game rushing with 173 yards on 12 carries. His previous high was 64 yards on five carries against Tulane (October 16, 2010) . . . prior to the rushing totals by Watts and Douglas, the last time a Tulsa player rushed for 100 or more yards in a game was G.J. Kinne who gained 190 yards against Houston (11/13/10) . . . the last time a Tulsa running back rushed for 100 or more yards in a game was Tarrion Adams who gained 207 yards in the GMAC Bowl against Ball State (1/6/09) . . . the last time two Tulsa players rushed for 100 or more yards in the same game was Tarrion Adams (116) and Courtney Tennial (109) against Rice (11/11/06) . . . Tulsa's 365 rushing yards is the most by a Tulsa team since the Hurricane tallied 439 yards rushing in the GMAC Bowl against Ball State (1/6/09) . . . Tulsa's defense held OSU All-American receiver Justin Blackmon to 57 yards on seven catches, which broke his NCAA record streak of 14 games with 100 or more yards receiving. It was Blackmon's lowest number of receiving yards since catching four passes for just 45 yards against Ole Miss (1/2/10) . . . with the loss, Tulsa falls to 15-56 against ranked opponents including 7-14 at home . . . Tulsa's loss to Oklahoma State marks its first loss in a home opener since dropping a 41-10 decision against Minnesota (9/1/05).

**Vs. #4 BOISE STATE** — Tulsa faced its fourth nationally-ranked opponent in five games dating back to last year. Boise State entered the game ranked No. 4 in both the *USA Today* and the *Associated Press* polls. Tulsa played consensus No. 1 Oklahoma in the season opener, faced No. 7/8 Oklahoma State on Sept. 17 and played No. 24 Hawai'i in the Sheraton Hawai'i Bowl at the end of last season . . . senior quarterback G.J. Kinne started his 29th-straight game . . . Tulsa freshman punter Cole Way had his first punt returned this season. His first 20 punts of the season went unreturned . . . recorded 155 rushing yards to just 131 by Boise State. The Golden Hurricane has out-rushed its opponents in the last three contests . . . through four games, the Golden Hurricane has yet to score a first-quarter touchdown . . . Boise State scored 27 points in the opening half. That total was the second-fewest allowed by Tulsa in its four games this season (31 to Oklahoma State and 30 to Oklahoma) . . . TU outscored Boise State 21-14 in the second half . . . senior linebacker Curnelius Arnick tied his career high with 18 tackles. The last time he recorded 18 tackles was in the season opener against No. 1 Oklahoma on Sept. 3. Arnick's previous career high for tackles in a single game entering the 2011 season was 12 . . . Arnick has 55 tackles through four games this season, and he is averaging 13.75 tackles per game . . . freshman defensive lineman Brentom Todd recorded first-career sack at the 2:09 mark of the third quarter. The sack was also the first allowed by Boise State all season . . . quarterback G.J. Kinne threw four interceptions, the most in his career . . . sophomore linebacker Shawn Jackson forced his first fumble of the season and the third of his career . . . sophomore running back Trey Watts recorded his first rushing TD of the season with a three-yard rush at 4:11 of the third quarter. He has now scored two touchdowns, one on the ground and one through the air . . . junior H-back Willie Carter scored on an eight-yard catch with 14:55 to play in the fourth quarter. The score was Carter's first of the season . . . junior wide receiver Ricky Johnson caught his first touchdown of the season at the 3:19 mark of the fourth quarter with a 13-yard pass from red-shirt freshman quarterback Kalen Henderson. Henderson now has three TD passes in the last two games.

**Vs. NORTH TEXAS** — Senior linebacker (#32) Curnelius Arnick wore #8 in the game in honor of former Golden Hurricane teammate and linebacker George Clinkscale, who died on September 21 at the age of 24 . . . Tulsa players also wore the initials "GC" on the back of their helmets, positioned next to "71 Just Keep Smiling." The #71 is in memory of former teammate Wilson Holloway who passed away in February 2011 after a long battle with Hodgkins lymphoma. Holloway would have been a senior offensive lineman this season . . . senior quarterback G.J. Kinne started his 30th straight game . . . junior Ricky Johnson made his first start of the season and 12th start of his career . . . at the 0:48 mark of the second quarter, Johnson caught a 12-yard pass from Kinne for his second touchdown in the last two games . . . junior receiver Bryan Burnham scored on a 49-yard pass from Kinne at 12:00 mark of the first quarter. It was Burnham's sixth touchdown of the season. The scoring play was also Kinne's 60th career passing touchdown . . . Burnham's scoring play also marked the first time this season that Tulsa scored a first quarter touchdown . . . in his first career start, true freshman cornerback Dwight Dobbins registered his first career interception at the 9:07 mark of the first quarter. Dobbins returned the pick for a 36-yard touchdown . . . in the first quarter, Tulsa's defense stopped North Texas on 4th and Goal from the 1-yard line play marking the second time in two games that Tulsa has held an opponent on 4th and Goal from the 1-yard line . . . late in the first quarter, junior cornerback Lowell Rose saw his first action since the first quarter of the Oklahoma game (9/3/11) . . . late in the first quarter, junior linebacker DeAundre Brown saw his first action this season. Brown made his first tackle of the season early in the second quarter . . . at the 1:58 mark of the second quarter, Shawn Jackson recorded his first quarterback sack of the season for a loss of eight yards . . . at the 1:50 mark of the second quarter, senior defensive end Tyrunn Walker blocked a field goal attempt. It was Tulsa's first blocked field goal of the season and the first of Walker's career . . . at the 1:41 mark of the second quarter, sophomore Trey Watts rushed for 35 yards. It was the longest run of his career. Watts' previous long was a 31-yard rush against Oklahoma State . . . Tulsa scored 28 points in the first half. Previously, Tulsa had a combined 23 first half points in its first four games of the season . . . Tulsa's 28 first half points are the most since the team scored 28 points in the first half against Southern Mississippi last season (11/26/10) . . . at the 12:28 mark of the third quarter, junior

safety Dexter McCoil returned an interception for a 74-yard touchdown. It was his first interception of the season and first interception return for a touchdown of his career. McCoil now has eight career interceptions . . . McCoil's 74-yard interception return for a touchdown was the longest by a Tulsa player since Marco Nelson's 81-yard touchdown return last season against Oklahoma State (9/18/10). McCoil's return also ties for the fifth longest in Tulsa history. Barry Minter returned an interception for a 74-yard touchdown against Southern Mississippi (10/3/92) . . . Dobbins and McCoil's interception returns for a touchdown marked the first time two Tulsa players accomplished that feat since the team did so against Hawai'i in the Hawai'i Bowl (12/24/10). In that game, Curnelius Arnick and John Flanders each had a 54-yard interception return for a touchdown . . . in the third quarter, junior defensive tackle Daeshon Bufford recorded his first career quarterback sack for an eight-yard loss . . . at the 6:43 mark of the third quarter, senior tight end Clay Sears caught a 60-yard pass from Kinne. His previous career long was a 31-yard reception against Sam Houston State (9/26/09) . . . at the 5:23 mark of the third quarter, junior H-back Willie Carter scored on a two-yard run. It was his second touchdown of the game and second career game with two or more touchdowns. Carter scored three touchdowns against Southern Mississippi last season (11/26/10) . . . Burnham finished the game with 101 yards on six receptions. It was his first career 100-yard receiving game. His previous career high was 94 yards against Tulane (9/10/11) . . . Kinne finished the game with 314 passing yards. It was his 10th career game with 300 or more passing yards and the first time he has surpassed that mark this season . . . Sears finished the game with 71 receiving yards on three catches. His previous career high for a game was 45 yards on three receptions against Sam Houston State (9/26/09). Sears' game yardage surpassed his 2010 season total of 64 yards . . . Tulsa scored 41 points marking the 27th time in the past five seasons that Tulsa has scored 40 or more points in a game.

**Vs. UAB** — Senior quarterback G.J. Kinne started his 31st consecutive game . . . senior left tackle Tyler Holmes started his 38th career game. He has started every game in which he has played since joining Tulsa as a freshman in 2008. Holmes missed six games in 2009 due to an injury . . . Kinne tossed an 18-yard touchdown pass to senior Clay Sears at the 8:53 mark of the first quarter. It marked the second consecutive game where Tulsa took its opening drive for a touchdown score . . . Kinne's touchdown pass to Sears bumped his career number of touchdowns responsible for to 75. That moved him past T.J. Rubley (1987-91) into sole possession of second place on Tulsa's career chart. Kinne ended the game with a new career total of 77 . . . junior H-back Willie Carter took a pass from Kinne 15 yards for a touchdown at the 2:46 mark of the second quarter. It was Carter's third consecutive game with a receiving touchdown and third total receiving touchdown for the season . . . sophomore receiver Jordan James caught a 68-yard pass from Kinne at the 0:38 mark of the second quarter. That was James' longest career reception. His previous long was 27 yards last season against Rice (11/6/10) . . . at the 0:26 mark of the second quarter, Clay Sears caught a 12-yard pass from G.J. Kinne. It was his fifth career touchdown and resulted in his first career multi-touchdown game . . . Tulsa's scoring drive that ended with the Kinne touchdown pass to Sears lasted 0:23. It was the second shortest scoring drive of the season (behind an 0:11 drive against Oklahoma State) and fourth drive of the season to take less than a minute . . . Fitzpatrick's 44-yard field goal at the 9:40 mark of the third quarter was his longest of the season . . . junior defensive end Jared St. John recorded his first career quarterback sack at the 14:39 mark of the fourth quarter . . . sophomore Ja'Terian Douglas scored on a 47-yard touchdown run at the 12:39 mark of the fourth quarter. It was his third touchdown of the season. All of Douglas' scoring plays have been 42 yards or longer (42, 47, 80) . . . Lowell Rose registered his first career interception at the 9:00 mark of the fourth quarter. The 41-yard return was the second longest this season . . . Tulsa had four turnovers in the game (three fumbles, one interception) marking the third time

### WHAT YOU DIDN'T KNOW ABOUT TULSA'S FOOTBALL TRADITION . . .

- Tulsa was the first school to play in five straight New Years Day Bowl Games — Sun Bowl (1-1-42), Sugar Bowl (1-1-43), Sugar Bowl (1-1-44), Orange Bowl (1-1-45) and Oil Bowl (1-1-46). Tulsa has played in 16 bowl games.
- Ellis Jones, an All-American guard in 1945, was a one-armed player. He was the defensive standout for the College All-Star team vs. the Chicago Bears in 1945.
- Three former TU football players are enshrined in the Pro Football Hall of Fame in Canton, Ohio. They are Bob St. Clair, Jim Finks and Steve Largent.
- Two former Tulsa players finished runner-up in the Heisman Trophy voting — quarterback Jerry Rhome in 1964 and receiver Howard Twilley in 1965.
- Perhaps the greatest Tulsa football player of all-time is Glenn Dobbs (1940-42). He was also head coach of the Hurricane teams in the 1960's. Eighth Street which is just north of Skelly Stadium was dedicated as Glenn Dobbs Drive on Oct. 21, 2000.
- Former TU players — Glenn Dobbs, Howard Twilley and Jerry Rhome — are enshrined in the College Football Foundation Hall of Fame.
- Some other former TU players went on to the NFL — Steve Largent, Drew Pearson, Rickey Watts, Don Blackmon, David Alexander, Jerry Ostroski, Gus Frerotte, Dennis Byrd, Tom Miner, Steve August and Gus Frerotte — to name a few.
- Coaching in the NFL — Tulsa has had four former players serve as head coaches in the NFL — Tommy Hudspeth (Detroit Lions); Sam Rutigliano (Cleveland Browns); Ray Rhodes (Philadelphia Eagles and Green Bay Packers); and Lovie Smith (Chicago Bears). Chicago Bears assistant coach Bob Babich is also a Tulsa graduate.
- Tulsa has three former players and two former coaches who have been inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame. The players are Glenn Dobbs, who also coached the Hurricane, Howard Twilley and Jerry Rhome . . . the coaches are Francis Schmidt (1919-21) and John Cooper (1977-84).

the Hurricane has tallied four or more turnovers in a game this season . . . Dexter McCoil recorded his second interception of the season and ninth of his career at the 2:46 mark of the fourth quarter . . . Clay Sears ended the game with 105 yards on nine receptions. It marked the first time a Tulsa tight end had more than 100 receiving yards since Garrett Mills caught eight receptions for 152 yards and a touchdown against UCF in the 2005 C-USA championship game (12/3/05) . . . Sears' two touchdowns also marked the first time a Tulsa tight end has done so since Mills caught two touchdowns against SMU (10/22/05) . . . Fitzpatrick finished the game with 13 points (four PATs, three field goals). He now has 242 career points moving him past Charles Clay (230) and Tarrion Adams (234) into eighth on Tulsa's all-time scoring chart . . . Fitzpatrick's three field goals in the game gave him 36 for his career. He passed Eric Lange (35) for sixth on Tulsa's career fields goal chart . . . Kinne ended the game with 34 rushing yards. He now has 1,098 career rushing yards. That total moves him past James Kilian (2001-04) into second place on Tulsa's career rushing chart among quarterbacks . . . Kinne passed for 341 yards on 31 of 43 attempts. It was his 11th career 300-yard passing game. Kinne now trails only Paul Smith (2003-07) for first of Tulsa's all-time chart. Smith threw for 300+ yards in 14 games . . . Kinne completed 31 passes on 43 attempts. That was one shy of his career high of 32 completions, which came against Southern Miss during his sophomore season (11/21/09) . . . Tulsa totaled 559 yards of offense on 87 plays. It was the first time Tulsa surpassed the 500-yard mark this season and it was the first time Tulsa has done so since its 531-yard performance against Hawai'i in last season's Hawai'i Bowl victory (12/24/10).

**Vs. RICE** . . . Tulsa wore alternate helmets for the game, a blue and white fiber pattern. It was the first time since 2009 the Hurricane wore helmets of a color other than gold. TU wore blue helmets three times that season and won all three games - vs. Sam Houston State, at Rice, and vs. Memphis . . . senior quarterback G.J. Kinne started his 32nd consecutive game . . . senior left tackle Tyler Holmes started his 39th career game. He has started every game in which he has played since joining Tulsa as a freshman in 2008. Holmes missed six games in 2009 due to an injury . . . Curnelius Arnick intercepted a pass on Rice's first play of the game. It was his first interception of the season and fifth of his career . . . Arnick tallied 12 tackles in the game. It was his fifth game this season with double-digit tackles and 13th of his career . . . Tulsa scored on its first drive on a one-yard run by G.J. Kinne with 13:15 left in the first quarter. It was the fastest the Hurricane has reached the end zone in a game this season, and third straight game in which it scored on its first drive . . . Dexter McCoil picked an interception on Rice's second drive of the game. It was his third interception of the season and 10th of his career . . . the Tulsa defense forced its third turnover in Rice first three drives of the game when Jared St. John forced a fumble and Shawn Jackson recovered the ball at the Rice 41 yard line. It was St. John's first forced fumble of the season and Jackson's first fumble recovery of the season . . . Kevin Fitzpatrick made a 52-yard field goal with 4:37 remaining in the first quarter. It was a career-long field goal for Fitzpatrick, whose previous career-long was 51 yards against East Carolina in 2009 (11/15/09) . . . the 17 points Tulsa scored in the first quarter was the most it has scored in the opening period this season . . . G.J. Kinne threw a 64-yard touchdown pass to Willie Carter in the second quarter. It was the longest touchdown pass of the season for Tulsa . . . Willie Carter had 105 receiving yards by halftime. He finished with 160 receiving yards in the game. It was the third straight week the Hurricane had a different receiver with more than 100 yards receiving. Bryan Burnham had 101 yards vs. North Texas (10/1) and Clay Sears had 105 yards vs. UAB (10/15) . . . Carter's 160 receiving yards was a career high. His previous career high was 135 yards at Oklahoma on Sept. 3 . . . Fitzpatrick missed a 35-yard field goal wide left in the third quarter. It was his first miss of the season and first miss in 10 attempts dating back to the 2010 season (vs. UTEP 11/20/10). He was a perfect 7-for-7 in 2011 before the miss . . . Fitzpatrick totaled eight points (one field goal, five extra points), and moved into a tie for sixth place on the Tulsa career scoring chart with 250 points. Kinne totaled 352 yards of offense in the game (318 passing, 34 rushing). He now has 9,135 yards of total offense in his career at Tulsa, and moved into second place on the TU career total offense chart. He surpassed T.J. Rubley, who totaled 9,080 from 1987-91 . . . Tulsa scored 30 or more points for the third straight game in the 38-20 victory at Rice. The Hurricane previously defeated North Texas 41-24 and UAB, 37-20. It was also the fifth game this season TU has scored 30-plus points . . . Kinne passed for more than 300 yards for the third straight game. He totaled 318 at Rice after tossing for 314 vs. North Texas and 341 vs. UAB . . . Trey Watts totaled 100 yards of offense (68 rushing, 32 receiving). It was the second times this season he has totaled 100 or more yards of offense in a game. He rushed for 159 yards against Oklahoma State on Sept. 17 . . . Watts scored one rushing touchdown and one receiving touchdown in the game. It was his first career multiple touchdown game.

**Vs. SMU** . . . Senior quarterback G.J. Kinne started his 33rd consecutive game . . . senior left tackle Tyler Holmes started his 41st career game. He has started every game in which he has played since joining Tulsa as a freshman in 2008. Holmes missed six games in 2009 due to an injury . . . senior cornerback Milton Howell registered his second career interception at the 5:12 mark of the first quarter. Howell returned the interception for a career high 35 yards . . . freshman defensive back Kwame Sexton picked up his first career fumble recovery at the 12:39 mark of the second quarter on a muffed punt return . . . sophomore defensive tackle Joe King recorded his first career tackle for loss at the 9:51 mark. The tackle resulted in a 12-yard loss . . . Howell intercepted his second pass of the game at the 1:43 mark of the second quarter. The last time a Tulsa player had more than one interception in a game was last season when Curnelius Arnick accomplished the feat against Hawai'i in the Hawai'i Bowl (12/24/10) . . . Howell picked off his third pass of the game at the 0:36 mark of the second quarter.

It ties a school record set by several Tulsa players and marks the first time since last season when Marco Nelson had three interceptions against Houston (11/13/10) . . . at the end of the first half, Tulsa led SMU 24-0. It marked the first time Tulsa has shut out an opponent in the first half since the Hurricane posted a 35-0 halftime lead against New Mexico (9/20/08) . . . Tulsa's 24 points also marked the fourth consecutive game in which the Hurricane scored 24 or more in the first half . . . junior running back Alex Singleton scored his third rushing touchdown of the game at the 5:07 mark of the third quarter. It marked the first three-touchdown game by a Tulsa player since Tarrion Adams scored three rushing touchdowns against Ball State in the GMAC Bowl (1/6/09). Singleton now has 15 career rushing touchdowns and four career multi-touchdown games . . . senior linebacker Alan Dock ended SMU's drive with his second career interception (and second this season) at the 5:00 minute mark of the fourth quarter . . . senior tight end Michael Britton recorded his first career reception (10 yards) at the 4:53 mark of the fourth quarter . . . senior tight end Nathan Largen recorded his first career reception (seven yards) at the 2:51 mark of the fourth quarter . . . junior H-back Willie Carter finished the game with 13 catches for 173 yards. Both were new career highs besting his performance from last week against Rice (9-160). It also marked his third career 100-yard receiving game (all three coming this season) . . . senior kicker Kevin Fitzpatrick kicked five PAT's giving him 144 for his career. He now ranks fifth on the C-USA career PAT's made chart . . . with one rushing touchdown and one passing touchdown, Kinne moved into a tie for 10th place on the C-USA all-time chart with 83 touchdowns responsible for. He is tied with Gino Guidugli (Louisville/1999-2002) and Dave Ragone (Louisville/2001-04) . . . Tulsa's 38-7 victory (+31 points) marked the most lopsided of any game in the Tulsa-SMU series. Tulsa's previous high margin of victory was in 2003 when the Hurricane defeated SMU 35-16 (+19 points). The previous overall high margin of victory was in 1998 when SMU defeated Tulsa 33-3 (+30) . . . Tulsa held SMU to its lowest point total of the 2011 season (seven) and lowest point total of the series, matching Tulsa's 1943 game against SMU in which Tulsa won 21-7 . . . Tulsa has scored 30 points or more in four straight games.

**Vs. UCF** . . . Senior quarterback G.J. Kinne started his 34th consecutive game . . . senior left tackle Tyler Holmes started his 42nd career game. He has started every game in which he has played since joining Tulsa as a freshman in 2008. Holmes missed six games in 2009 due to an injury . . . the Golden Hurricane improved to 6-3 on the season and 5-0 in league play. UCF dropped to 4-5 overall and 2-3 in C-USA action . . . TU is now bowl eligible . . . the Hurricane improved to 3-2 all-time against UCF. The two teams are now 2-2 when playing in Orlando . . . Tulsa has now won 10-straight games in Conference USA play dating back to last season. This mark ties for the third-longest in league history. The record is 13 . . . Willie Carter rushed for a 19-yard touchdown with 3:17 to play in the first quarter. It was his second rushing TD of the season and the seventh of his career. It was also the first offensive touchdown allowed by UCF at home all season . . . UCF quarterback Jeff Godfrey found receiver J.J. Worton for a 28-yard touchdown on the first Knights' possession. It was the first time all season Tulsa allowed an opening-drive touchdown . . . Tulsa scored 24 points against the Knights. UCF entered the game having allowed just nine points at home all season . . . senior linebacker Curnelius Arnick recorded a career-high 19 tackles. It was the sixth time this season he hit the double-digit tackle plateau, and the 14th time in his career . . . his 19 tackles were the most since Chris Chamberlain recorded 20 on Nov. 10, 2007 against Houston . . . Arnick now has 113 tackles this season. It's the second-straight year he reached triple digits. He also surpassed the 300-tackle mark for his career. He now has 310 for his career, and he is 11 away from 10th place on TU's all-time tackle list (Dennis Byrd, 321) . . . UCF entered the game fifth in the nation with 85 yards rushing allowed. Tulsa ended the game with 251 yards on the ground . . . senior defensive end Tyrunn Walker recorded his second block of the season at the end of the first half. He blocked Shawn Moffitt's 46-yard field goal attempt . . . UCF held a 14-13 advantage at halftime. It was the first time TU trailed at the half since the Boise State game Sept. 24. It was also the first time TU won a game when trailing at intermission . . . senior kicker Kevin Fitzpatrick nailed three field goals against UCF. He now has 41 for his career . . . UCF entered the game second in the nation in time of possession with an average of 34:51 per game. The Knights had just 32:50 TOP against Tulsa . . . this was the first time in 2011 Tulsa did not commit a penalty in a game . . . senior tight end Clay Sears scored his fourth receiving touchdown of the season to give Tulsa the lead for good at the 8:23 mark of the fourth quarter. The play was a 16-yard pass from Kinne. Sears now has six TD's for his career . . . Tulsa was successful on a two-point conversion following the touchdown by Sears. This was the first two-point conversion attempt of the season for Tulsa. It was also the first time UCF has allowed a successful two-point conversion since Oct. 17, 2009 at Miami.

**Vs. MARSHALL** . . . Tulsa wore throwback helmets and jerseys for today's game. The Golden Hurricane wore solid gold pants with red jerseys that are a tribute to the 1950s. The helmets were solid gold with a red "T" on the front, which is a tribute to the 1940s when the team wore white helmets with a "T" on the front . . . senior quarterback G.J. Kinne started his 35th consecutive game . . . senior left tackle Tyler Holmes started his 43rd career game. He has started every game in which he has played since joining Tulsa as a freshman in 2008. Holmes missed six games in 2009 due to an injury . . . Clay Sears caught a two-yard pass from Kinne at the 10:18 mark of the first quarter. It was his fifth touchdown catch of the year and seventh of his career . . . Tulsa scored touchdowns on its two opening offensive possessions for the second time this season. The other game was against Rice when Tulsa scored touchdowns after the defense came up with consecutive interceptions . . . junior H-back Willie Carter caught a 26-yard touchdown pass from Kinne at the 13:45 mark of the second quarter. Carter has scored a receiving touchdown in six of the last seven games. He has eight total touchdowns this season and 16 career touchdowns (11 receiv-

ing, five rushing) . . . junior safety Dexter McCoil intercepted a pass at the 6:12 mark of the second quarter. It was his fourth interception this year and 11th interception of his career. McCoil is now two shy of Tulsa's all-time record of 13 previously set by Nate Harris (1982-84) and Jeff Jordan (1962-64) and is tied with six other players for 15th on C-USA career interceptions chart . . . at the 2:01 mark of the second quarter, Kinne completed a 28-yard pass to senior tight end Nathan Largen. That play gave Kinne exactly 10,000 career yards of total offense. Kinne is the second player in Tulsa history to reach that mark (Paul Smith/2003-07) and the 11th player in C-USA history to hit 10,000 career yards. Kinne finished the game with 10,064 career yards of total offense . . . at the 0:48 mark of the second quarter, Kinne completed a 16-yard touchdown pass to senior tight end Clay Sears. It was Kinne's third passing touchdown of the game and his 73rd career passing touchdown. That tied him for second on Tulsa's all-time passing touchdown chart with T.J. Rubley (1987-91) . . . Tulsa's 42 first half points were the most by the Golden Hurricane since Tulsa scored 49 points in the first half against UTEP (10/18/08). Tulsa won that game 77-35. Tulsa also had 41 first half points against Rice last season (11/6/10) in a 64-21 victory . . . at the 12:54 mark of the third quarter, Marshall running back Travon Van scored on a 69-yard touchdown run. It was the longest run given up by Tulsa's defense this season. The previous long run given up by Tulsa's defense was a 35-yard play by Oklahoma's Dominique Whaley (9/3/11) . . . Burnham caught a 35-yard pass from Kinne at the 11:04 mark of the third quarter. It was Burnham's team-leading seventh receiving touchdown of the season. Burnham finished the game with a career-high of 136 yards on a career-high 10 receptions. His previous highs were 101 yards against North Texas (10/1/11) and seven receptions against Tulane (9/10/11) . . . sophomore running back Ja'Terian Douglas, who made his second career start, rushed for 48 yards on Tulsa's opening play of its first possession. Douglas also ran for a career-high 82-yard rushing play at the 12:45 mark of the fourth quarter. He now has runs this season of 82, 80, 38, 47 and 42 (the runs of 80, 47 and 42 resulted in touchdowns) . . . at the 2:30 mark of the fourth quarter, senior defensive end Durrell Finch recorded his first career forced fumble and sophomore linebacker Donnell Hawkins recorded his first career fumble recovery . . . Tulsa had three scoring drives under 0:48 against Marshall (0:30, 0:05, 0:38) Tulsa now has 10 scoring drives of 0:48 or less. The other drives were against Oklahoma State (0:11, 0:07, 0:34), UAB (0:23,0:48), Rice (0:16) and SMU (0:39) . . . Douglas finished the game with a new career high 194 yards rushing. His previous best was 173 yards against Oklahoma State (9/17/11). Douglas' effort was the most for a Tulsa player since Eric Richardson rushed for 194 yards against San Jose State (11/18/00) . . . Watts finished the game with 144 yards on eight carries. It was his second 100-yard rushing game for both the season and for his career . . . Tulsa finished the game with two 100-yard rushers (Watts, Douglas), a 100-yard receiver (Burnham) and a 300-yard passer (Kinne). The last time that happened was against Rice (11/11/06) when Tarrion Adams rushed for 116 yards, Courtney Tennial rushed for 109 yards, Paul Smith threw for 308 yards and Ryan Bugg had a 145 receiving yards . . . Kinne finished the game with 302 yards passing. It was his 13th career game with 300 or more yards passing in a game. He is just one 300-yard game shy of tying Paul Smith (2003-07) for Tulsa's school record of 14 . . . Kinne now has 8,782 career passing yards and ranks 13th on the C-USA all-time passing yardage chart . . . Kinne finished the game with four passing touchdown passes. That marked the fifth time Kinne has thrown four or more touchdowns in game. His career best was a five-touchdown performance against East Carolina (9/5/10) . . . Kinne now has 74 career passing touchdowns. He surpassed T.J. Rubley (1987-91) for second on Tulsa's all-time passing touchdowns chart . . . Kinne also moved into 10th on the C-USA career touchdowns chart (74) and into eighth on the C-USA career chart for touchdown responsibility (88) . . . junior Alex Singleton scored three rushing touchdowns. It was his second career game with three touchdowns. Singleton's first three-touchdown game was earlier this season against SMU (10/29/11). Singleton now has 16 career touchdowns (all rushing) . . . senior linebacker Curnelius Arnick had seven tackles in the game and now has 317 for his career. He moved past Levi Gillen (1994-97) into 11th on Tulsa's all-time tackles chart and is just four shy of Dennis Byrd (1985-88) for 10th place . . . senior kicker Kevin Fitzpatrick scored 11 points and now has 279 career point. He is one point shy of Brad DeVault (2002-05) for third place and two points shy of Jason Staurovsky (1981-85) for second place . . . Fitzpatrick's 279 career points moves him into 10th on the C-USA career chart for points scored by kicking . . . Tulsa finished the game with 682 yards of total offense. It was the most yards compiled by Tulsa this season and the second game this season with 500 or more yards . . . Tulsa's 682 total yards of offense is the most since the team compiled 791 against UTEP (10/18/08) . . . Tulsa's 59 points was the most scored this season and the most scored since 62-35 victory against Hawai'i in the Hawai'i Bowl (12/24/10) . . . Tulsa now has 11 consecutive victories against C-USA opponents dating back to last season. That is two conference wins shy of the all-time record. Tulsa's last C-USA loss was last season against SMU (10/9/10) . . . Tulsa had 32 first downs, which was the most since the Hurricane had 33 first downs against Southern Miss (11/21/09).

**Vs. UTEP** . . . For the second time this season, Tulsa wore their blue weave helmets. The other time came against Rice . . . Tulsa improved to 8-3 overall marking the sixth time in the last seven years that the Hurricane has won at least eight games in a season . . . Tulsa improved its series record against UTEP to 12-8, including 6-4 in El Paso . . . senior tight end/H-Back and former walk-on Michael Britton received his first career start against UTEP . . . senior quarterback G.J. Kinne started his 36th straight game, while offensive tackle Tyler Holmes started his 40th career game, starting every game that he has played of his career (missing 6 games in 2009 with an injury) . . . Alex Singleton had his eighth rushing TD of the game for Tulsa's second score and the 19th of his career . . . Cory Dorris had his second blocked PAT of the season and it was the

fourth blocked kick this season for the Hurricane. The other two were blocked field goals . . . Trey Watts' 53-yard TD reception was the longest reception of his career, and was his second longest play from scrimmage as his longest was a 58-yard run against Marshall last week. Watts' 94-yard kickoff return was the longest for Tulsa since Damaris Johnson had a 94-yarder last year against Rice on Nov. 6, 2010. It ties for the 13th-longest in school history. Previously, Tulsa has had four 100-yard returns, six 98-yard returns, two 96-yard returns and now with Watts' return has five 94-yard returns . . . Watts' return is the second time in the series' history that Tulsa has returns a kickoff for a touchdown against UTEP. The previous one came in 2008 when Damaris Johnson also had a 94-yard return . . . Tulsa had 29 points at halftime. It's the fifth time in the last six games that Tulsa has scored 24 or more first-half points. Tulsa had 24 against UAB, Rice and SMU and 42 last week against Marshall. The only game in the last six games that the Hurricane did not score at least 24 points in the first half was against UCF with 13 . . . Watts had 238 all-purpose yards in the first half for his third game this year with 200+ all-purpose yards. He finished with 202 yards against OSU and 228 against Marshall . . . Shawn Jackson had his second career interception return for a touchdown and his first this year. He also had a 66-yard INT return last year at Notre Dame . . . senior place-kicker Kevin Fitzpatrick tied the school record for scoring with 286 career points on his seven PATs. With three first-half PATs, Fitzpatrick moved into second place on the school's career scoring chart with 282 career points, surpassing Brad DeVault (280) and Jason Staurovsky (281) . . . Ja'Terian Douglas scored his seventh career touchdown and fourth of the season with a 37-yarder. All seven of his TD runs have covered more than 15 yards — including TD runs of 18, 20 and 33 yards last year and 42, 47, 80 and 37 yards this year . . . Curnelius Arnick had his seventh double-figure tackle game of the season and 15th in his career . . . Arnick moved into seventh place on the school's all-time tackles chart with 331 career stops. He had 14 tackles against the Miners . . . Tulsa has scored 40+ points for third time this season, including 41 vs. North Texas and 59 against Marshall. It also marks the 28th time that Tulsa has scored 40+ points since the 2007 season. It is 15th time over the last five seasons that Tulsa has scored 50 or more points . . . Tulsa has scored 50+ points in consecutive games (59 vs. Marshall) for the first time since the final two games of the 2010 season – 56 vs. Southern Miss, 62 vs. Hawaii . . . Kinne had his 14th career 300+ passing game . . . Kinne had three TD passes and now has 77 career TD passes, six shy of tying Paul Smith (2003-07) for the all-time lead.

**Vs. #7/8 HOUSTON** . . . Senior quarterback G.J. Kinne started his 37th-straight game. Kinne has started every game in his three seasons at Tulsa . . . senior offensive Tyler Holmes started his 41st career game, starting every game that he has played in his career (missing 6 games in 2009 with an injury) . . . junior H-back Willie Carter caught an 11-yard touchdown pass from Kinne at the 9:16 mark of the first quarter. It was Carter's seventh receiving touchdown of the season and his team-leading ninth total touchdown this year. Carter started the game after missing last week's game at UTEP (11/19/11) due to an injury sustained two weeks ago against Marshall (11/12/11) . . . after Houston's first touchdown drive of the game, junior defensive end Cory Dorris blocked the point after attempt. It was his third blocked PAT of the season and fourth of his career. Dorris' other blocks came against Boise State (9/24/11), UTEP (11/19/11) and Notre Dame (10/30/10). Dorris also blocked a field goal last season against UTEP (11/20/10) . . . senior linebacker Curnelius Arnick recovered his first fumble of the season at the 7:51 mark of the third quarter. He now has four career fumbles, one in each of his seasons at Tulsa . . . after Tulsa's first touchdown scoring drive, senior kicker Kevin Fitzpatrick converted the point after touchdown. That gave Fitzpatrick 287 career points, which broke a tie with Jarod Tracy (2004-08) for first on Tulsa's all-time scoring chart. Fitzpatrick finished the game with seven total points and now has 293 total points for his career . . . Fitzpatrick's 293 career total points moved him into seventh place on C-USA's all-time scoring chart and sixth on C-USA's all-time scoring chart for kicking only . . . Fitzpatrick kicked a 52-yard field goal at the 1:14 mark of the first quarter. That tied his career long from earlier this year against Rice (10/22/11). Fitzpatrick also added a 51-yard field goal at the 7:02 mark of the third quarter. He now has four career field goals of 50 yards or longer, three of which were from this season . . . at the end of the third quarter, Fitzpatrick booted a career-best 59-yard punt . . . Trey Watts ended the game with 62 rushing yards and now has 1,040 for his career. Watts joined sophomore running back Ja'Terian Douglas in the 1,000-yard rushing club. Douglas now has 1,126 career rushing yards . . . Kinne ended the game with one touchdown pass and now has 25 on the season. He is the first Tulsa quarterback to throw for 25 or more touchdowns in two separate seasons. Kinne threw 31 touchdowns last season . . . with his touchdown pass, Kinne moved into a tie with Danny Wimprine (Memphis/2001-04) for seventh on the C-USA chart for touchdown responsibility. He now has 93 touchdowns. That is also second best in Tulsa history behind Paul Smith (2003-07) who had 111 career touchdowns . . . Kinne's touchdown pass also moved him into a tie with Gino Guidugli (Louisville/2001-04) for eighth on the C-USA passing touchdown chart. Kinne now has 78 career passing touchdowns, which is five behind Paul Smith . . . Kinne had 176 passing yards, which moved him past Patrick Ramsey (Tulane/1998-2001) for 11th on C-USA's all-time chart. Kinne now has 9,258 career yards . . . Kinne had 19 completions on 38 attempts. He now has 713 career completions. He is the second player in Tulsa history to complete 700 or more passes. Paul Smith has the most career completions with 808 . . . Kinne is also the 12th player in C-USA history to complete 700 or more passes . . . Kinne compiled 51 total plays on offense and now has 1,582 for his career. He moved past Paul Smith to take the top spot in Tulsa history. Kinne also passed Smith for 10th best in C-USA history . . . Arnick finished the game with eight total tackles and now has 339 career tackles. He moved from seventh to sixth on Tulsa's all-time tackles chart breaking a tie with Ashon Farley (1997-2000) and surpassing Don Blackmon (1976, 1978-80).

## IN MEMORY

In the last nine months, the Tulsa football program has lost three former football student-athletes who had been a part of this team since 2004.

Wilson Holloway lost his long battle with Hodgkins Lymphoma in February. He would have been a fifth-year senior this season.

On September 21, 2011, former Tulsa linebacker George Clinkscale (2005-09) lost his life. He played as a true freshman in 2005, red-shirted in 2006, then started for three years (2006-09). He played in 53 career games and started 33 contests. He had 127 tackles, 18 stops for -92 yards and four fumble recoveries in his career. He played and started all 12 games as a senior in 2009 and was credited with 34 tackles. Clinkscale earned his degree in exercise sports science.

On Tuesday, October 18th, the Hurricane football program took another hit as four-year letterman Anthony Germany (2004-07) died after a short illness due to an injury. Germany was a three-year starter at safety for the Hurricane.

On the Tulsa helmet, a sticker displaying "71 Keep Smiling" was a remembrance of Holloway. "GC" was added to the helmet in the memory of Clinkscale.

The team will be wearing a new sticker beginning with the SMU game displaying the numbers of the three players — #3 for Germany, #8 for Clinkscale and #71 for Holloway.
