NINTH ANNUAL BELL HELICOPTER ARMED FORCES BOWL - The 2011 game will feature two high-powered offenses as the 9-3 Cougars of Brigham Young University play the 8-4 Golden Hurricane of the University of Tulsa on December 30 at Gerald J. Ford Stadium in Dallas. For the second-straight year, the **Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl** is set for 11 a.m. (CST) kickoff as BYU finished with the top record among Football Bowl Subdivision independents while Tulsa finished second in the West Division of Conference USA with a 7-1 record. As the official bowl game that honors all branches of the United States armed forces, the **Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl** will be aired nationally by ESPN and ESPN Radio.

YEAR TWO AT THE FORD - After playing the first seven **Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl** games at Amon G. Carter Stadium in Fort Worth, the post-season game will be played at SMU's Gerald J. Ford Stadium for the second-straight season due to the renovations at TCU complex.

TOUGH LOSSES - With a combined record of 17-7, BYU and Tulsa's setbacks this season were to seven bowl-bound schools with six being ranked in the final BCS standings. BYU dropped decisions to No. 18 TCU and No. 24 Texas. All four of the Golden Hurricane setbacks in 2011 were to schools ranked among the top 20 teams in the current BCS rankings (Oklahoma State, third; Boise State, seventh; Oklahoma, 14th and Houston, 19th).

BYU - The Cougars accepted an invitation to play in the 2011 **Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl** on the afternoon of November 20 before BYU defeated New Mexico State 42-7 that evening. BYU ended its regular-season by posting a 41-20 win at Hawai'i to post the Cougars' eighth victory in their last nine games.

TULSA - The Golden Hurricane accepted their bid to play in the **Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl** December 4. Tulsa, which will be playing in the bowl for the second-time, finished the 2011 regular season by winning seven of their its eight games.

HOME/VISITORS, JERSEYS, LOCKERROOMS - Tulsa is the designated home team and will wear blue uniform tops along with using the home team locker room (SMU). BYU will be the visiting team and will wear white tops along with using the visiting locker room. Both teams will exit through the tunnel at the north end of Gerald J. Ford Stadium. The Tulsa bench will be on the west side of the Gerald J. Ford Stadium and BYU bench will be on the east side.

BELL HELICOPTER ARMED FORCES BOWL TICKETS - Tickets for the 2011 **Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl** went on sale September 1. Starting November 15 through the December 30 kickoff, the cost per seat will be \$60. The bowl is also selling a limited number of premium club seats for \$150 per ticket located in Ford Stadium's indoor club section on the west side of the stadium. Group ticket packages are available online at www.ArmedForcesBowl.com. Detailed ticket information for the 2011 **Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl** can be obtained through the bowl's web site or by calling the bowl office at 817/810-0012. As part of the bowls tribute to the armed force, military veterans receive discounted tickets at \$30 per ticket and active-duty military personnel receive free admittance via the Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl corporate military ticket underwriting program.

NAVY 2013 & 2016, ARMY 2014 & 2017 - It was in September that the United States Naval Academy has extended its agreement to also compete in the 2016 **Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl** after signing an initial contract to play in the 2013 game. The United States Military Academy also signed an agreement in September to play in the 2014 and 2017 **Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl** games.

BELL HELICOPTER - A Textron Inc. Company, Bell Helicopter agreed August 23, 2006 to title sponsor the post-season college football game formerly known as both the PlainsCapital Fort Worth Bowl (2003 and 2004) and the Fort Worth Bowl (2005), which is now the Armed Forces Bowl. With those changes, the official name is the **Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl**. Bell Helicopter announced the renewal of its option to sponsor the 2008 and 2009 games at a 2007 Team Announcement Party (December 7, 2007). On September 9, 2009, President and CEO John Garrison announced a new agreement for **Bell Helicopter** to continue as the **Armed Forces Bowl** title sponsor through the 2011 game with a set option for two additional years for the 2012 and 2013 contests.

BELL HELICOPTER-TEXTRON is an American manufacturer of commercial and military helicopters and tiltrotor aircraft with its headquarters in Fort Worth. Bell Helicopter provides the United States Armed Forces with the world's best military helicopters, including the V-22 Osprey, the OH-58D Kiowa Warrior, the AH-1Z Viper and UH-1Y Venom helicopters. A sister company, Textron Systems, produces the new M1117 Armored Security Vehicle, which is designed for speed and for deflecting rocket-propelled grenades and land mines.

2010 BELL HELICOPTER ARMED FORCES BOWL - Army's wins and losses in recent seasons have many times been determined by the turnover margin. Before a Gerald J. Ford Stadium record crowd of 36,742, the Black Knights used three first half turnovers to provide the spark for a 16-14 triumph over SMU in the eighth annual Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl. The victory pushed Army's final record to 7-6, the first winning season in 14 years. SMU wound up with a 7-7 ledger. On SMU's third play of the game, quarterback Kyle Pardon fumbled and senior defensive end Josh McNary picked up the loose ball and ran 55 yards for a touchdown to give Army a lead it never relinquished. Linebacker Stephen Anderson, Army's Most Outstanding Player with his game-high 14 tackles, and sophomore defensive back Josh Jackson had first half interceptions to stall SMU drives. Army entered the game tied for seventh nationally in turnover margin at +1.08 a game. Since the start of the 2006 season, the Black Knights are 14-4 when winning the turnover battle. Despite holding the edge in the turnover battle and benefitting from two missed SMU field goals, Army need two big offensive plays to secure the win. After SMU's Matt Szymanski missed a 47-yard field goal with 4:05 remaining in the game with Army nursing a 16-14 lead, the Black Knights offense ran out the clock thanks to two big third down plays. On third-and-five from their own 35-yard line with 3:20 showing on the clock, quarterback Trent Steelman ran for six yards and a first down. Then facing a third-and-four from the Army 47-yard line with 1:18 remaining, Steelman connected with Davyd Brooks with a 22-yard pass to seal the victory.

FORT WORTH-BASED - Due to the continued renovations at Amon G. Carter Stadium, the 2011 **Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl** will be played at the 32,000-seat Gerald J. Ford Stadium on the campus of Southern Methodist University in Dallas. After playing the first seven **Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl** games in Fort Worth, it was announced at the end of July 2010 to move the game to Dallas due to the planned Amon G. Carter Stadium renovations on the campus of Texas Christian University. The bowl management and SMU announced April 19, 2011 that the **Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl** would remain in Dallas for a second year. TCU's \$143-million renovation of the west side and north end zone of Amon G. Carter Stadium began immediately following TCU's final 2010 home game and is slated for completion prior to the Horned Frogs' 2012 regular season. Completely funded by donor support, the renovated Amon G. Carter Stadium will have a seating capacity of 43,000 that can be expanded to more than 50,000.

GERALD J. FORD STADIUM

In the history of the SMU football program, June 13, 1997 and September 2, 2000, may stand out as the most significant days since the program's inception in 1915. The first date is when University officials announced that significant funds had been raised to begin construction on the brand new Gerald J. Ford Stadium. The second is the date that Mustang football returned to campus with the inaugural game in the stadium against Kansas. The state-of-the-art facility would not have been possible without the generous donations of Gerald J. Ford, Lamar and Norma Hunt, Ray L. and Nancy Ann Hunt, and Sherrill and Jo Ann Pettus, all of whom are SMU alumni. Gerald J. Ford Stadium, finished in August of 2000 on the former Ownby Stadium grounds, has a horseshoe configuration with an open south end zone adjacent to Mockingbird Lane. The architecture is consistent with the Collegiate-Georgian style of the entire SMU campus and features traditional, yet state-of-the-art design concepts. The stadium has a seating capacity of 32,000 with the possibility for future expansion to 45,000. The 32,000-seat configuration includes nearly 600 preferred club level seats and 240 seats in 24 spacious luxury suites housed in a custom, three-level press box. In addition to housing preferred club and suite seating, the air-conditioned press box provides excellent sightlines and comfortably accommodates more than 125 working print, radio and television media. The playing surface is 25 feet below ground level, with half of the stadium's seats sunk below grade, ensuring a smooth transition into the surrounding neighborhood and the remainder of the SMU campus. Ford Stadium was designed by the sports and entertainment design division of Ellerbe Becket, Inc., an architectural firm based in Kansas City, Mo.

COMMON OPPONENT - The two schools have one common opponent as UCF dropped a pair of 24-17 decisions this season to both BYU and Tulsa. The BYU win over the Knights was September 24 in Provo as the Cougars overcame 10-3 and 17-10 deficits to win as Bryan Kariya's six yard run with 10:29 left in the game proved to be the winning score. The Tulsa win over UCF was November 3 in Orlando as G. J. Kinne's 16-yard scoring pass to Clay Sears with 8:23 left in the game proved to be the winning score for the Golden Hurricane.

BYU, TULSA AT THE FORD - Tulsa has played six games since 2000 against SMU at Gerald J. Ford Stadium where the Golden Hurricane captured one game with a 37-31 win over SMU in 2008. BYU has played SMU once in Dallas during the 1997 with a 19-16 overtime win.

BYU, TULSA AT DALLAS - While BYU is 2-0 for games played in Dallas, including a 1997 Cotton Bowl win over Kansas State, Tulsa is 4-8 in the North Texas city (3-7 at SMU, 1-0 vs. Texas A&M and 0-1 vs. St. Edwards). As for games in the Metroplex, BYU is 6-5 (North Texas in Denton, 1-1, SMU in Dallas, 1-0 and TCU, 2-3 in Fort Worth), including the Cotton Bowl victory and two appearances in Arlington (a 14-13 win in 2009 over Oklahoma and a 38-28 setback in 2011 to TCU). Tulsa is 12-17 in the Metroplex, including 6-4 in Denton against North Texas and 2-6 in Fort Worth against TCU.

BYU IN TEXAS - The Cougars will be playing in Texas for the third-time this season. BYU dropped 2011 decisions in Austin against Texas (16-17 on September 10) and in Arlington against TCU (28-38 on October 28). BYU has posted a 22-12-1 record for games played in Texas. BYU played four games in the state of Texas in 1997 by defeating Kansas State 19-15 in the Cotton Bowl on January 1 followed by an overtime win at SMU (19-16) before losing at Rice (14-27) and UTEP (3-14).

TULSA IN TEXAS - The Golden Hurricane has played 99 games in the state of Texas with the first one coming in Fort Worth October 21, 1921, as Tulsa suffered a 16-0 defeat to TCU. The Golden Hurricane defeated Rice 38-20 earlier this year (October 22) in Houston. Tulsa has a 39-59-1 overall record in Texas.

BYU vs. CUSA - Since the formation of C-USA in 1996, BYU has posted a 5-3 record against current or former schools from the conference, including two bowl games and two meetings with Tulsa. With a 24-17 win earlier this season over UCF, BYU now has an 43-12-1 all-time record against current Conference USA schools.

BYU vs. TULSA GAME NOTES (prepared by Bo Carter)

- Two teams with solid football traditions and back on the upward swing in recent years tangle in the ninth annual **Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl** at SMU's Ford Stadium in Dallas on December 30 as FBS independent BYU meets Tulsa of Conference USA.
- The ESPN national broadcast on both television and radio features not only two programs with a combined 46 previous bowl appearances and a composite 1,094 all-time victories (573 by Tulsa, 521 by BYU), but a pair of squads with some powerhouse performances in 2011.
- As both schools savor the traditions such as BYU's 13-0 mark and 1984 national championship along with a NCAA-record-tying 14 wins (14-1) and Cotton Bowl Classic win over Kansas State to top the 1996 season and Tulsa's five consecutive New Year's Day bowl appearances from 1941-1945 to start a long trek of postseason appearances.
- The Cougars now have competed in 11 bowl bashes since 1998, including the school-best seven consecutive since 2005 under Mendenhall, while Tulsa continues its climb back to glory with seven bowl visits since 2003. The Golden Hurricane has won five of its last six postseason treks since 2003, and the teams are a combined 9-3 in 12 bowl bouts over the past nine years.
- With 48 conference championships between the schools (25 by Tulsa and 23 by BYU), some of the nation's most competitive schedules (Tulsa faced Oklahoma, Oklahoma State, Boise State, and North Texas outside CUSA), a combined 21 consensus All-America choices, 1990 Heisman Trophy recipient Ty Detmer of BYU, and 11 members of the National Football Foundation College Hall of Fame, the great histories echo with national accomplishments.
- The only "if" in the ointment is Tulsa's ability to break a 6-1 series stranglehold by the Cougars. The 'Cane was impressive in its win during the last meeting between the teams - a 55-47 score fest at Tulsa in 2007 - but BYU was dominant in the first six meetings from 1971-2006.
- Since a relatively-routine 27-7 BYU triumph at Tulsa in 1971, the teams have scorched the scoreboards for 485 points in the most recent meetings for a composite average of 81 points and 924 total yards.
- The Cougars, 9-3, own key wins over teams from the Southeastern, Conference USA, Pacific-12, and Western Athletic Conferences along with a 17-16 near-miss loss at Big 12 contender Texas. Victories such as a 14-13 triumph at Ole Miss to start the season and 24-17 verdict over defending CUSA champion UCF have boosted the Y's confidence prior to postseason. BYU capped the regular campaign with a 41-20 victory at Hawai'i.
- The Golden Hurricane, 8-4 overall and a sizzling 7-1 in Conference USA, came within one victory of playing in the CUSA championship against Top 25 power Southern Miss. Tulsa won seven of their last eight games to finish behind 12-1 Houston (8-0 CUSA) in the circuit's West Division and had the third-best overall record in the conference.
- These performances come as no surprise to longtime observers of seven-year head coach Bronco Mendenhall with the Cougars and one of the oldest first-year college head coaches (turns 55 on December 12) in the 'Cane's Bill Blankenship.
- Mendenhall has guided seven consecutive BYU squads to postseason play and is 65-24 overall and 4-2 in his first six bowls as a head coach. He took 2006-2009 Cougar crews to 10-win seasons for four consecutive campaigns.
- Blankenship patiently awaited his college turn while guiding high school programs, most notably Tulsa Union, to 205 wins in 20 seasons and then returning to the school where he played quarterback from 1975-1979 (redshirted in '76).
- Individual standouts also abound for both squads. Led by Riley Nelson, the BYU quarterbacks completed 243 total passes for 2,919 yards and 25 touchdowns. Nelson had a career-best 363 yards in Honolulu finale against Hawai'i as BYU topped FBS independents with a 9-3 record by winning eight of their last nine games.
- The Cougars have five Texans on their 2011 roster, including redshirt freshman wide receiver Ross Apo (Arlington Oakridge School), senior wide receiver McKay Jacobson (Southlake Carroll), junior linebacker Brandon Ogletree (McKinney), redshirt sophomore lineman Manaaki Vaitai (Eules Trinity) and redshirt freshman lineman Michael Yeck (Keller). Apo (34 catches for 453 yards and a team-high nine touchdowns) and Jacobson (23, 279, 1) are second and sixth, respectively, in pass receptions for the Cougars. Ogletree is BYU's top tackler with 67 total stops, including 34 unassisted tackles. He has 3.5 tackles for losses with one fumble recovery, one pass interception and two forced fumbles. Yeck is a backup at left offensive tackle.
- Wideout Cody Hoffman (four catches per game, 15 yards per reception) and RB JJ Di Luigi (5.2 yards per carry) also lead a balanced offensive attack. Cougar defenders LBs Brandon Ogletree and Kyle Van Noy (10 TFL, three pass interceptions) also are keys to a win.
- Tulsa QB G.J. Kinne, son of Baylor great and longtime and inspirational Texas high school mentor Gary Joe Kinne, not only is a three-time All-Academic Conference USA choice but the possessor 715 career completions for 9,200-plus yards, 78 touchdowns and just under 61 percent completion rate. Kinne finished his Texas prep career (Gilmer and Canton) ranked third in state history in passing yards (11,695) and second in TD passes (130).
- Kinne gets his assistance from RBs Ja'Terian Douglas (Arlington Lamar High School) and Trey Watts, who have 1,727 net rushing yards between them and total averages of nearly over seven yards with each rushing touch. WR Willie Carter (14.2 yards per catch on 61 receptions) and LB Curnelius Arnick from Dallas Carter High School heads a ball-hawking defense with 16 pass interceptions and numerous blitz schemes.

It was a penalty-ridden game for the Cougars, with nine flags for 98 yards.

PROVO, November 4, 1995 - BYU withstood a third quarter rally by Tulsa to defeat the soon-to-be Western Athletic Conference foe Tulsa 45-35 as quarterback Steve Sarkisian passed for 326 yards and one touchdown while scoring the deciding touchdown with a 3-run run. After Golden Hurricane tailback Solomon White ran 38 yards for the game's first score, BYU scored the next 21 points highlighted by a four-yard run by Hema Heimuli, a two-point conversion by Sarkisian and a 22-yard fumble return by Dermell Reed for a touchdown after Stan Raass forced the turnover by White. After Tulsa scored on a fake reverse, the Cougars secured a 28-14 half-time lead on Sarkisian's 33-yard touchdown pass to Mike Johnson. After recovering an attempted on-side kick to start the second half, BYU scored on a Mark Atuaia three-yard run to give BYU a 35-14. Tulsa took a 10-7 lead after a blocked punt led to a Jarod Tracy 25-yard field goal midway through the second quarter. BYU scored touchdowns on its next three possessions to take a 28-10 lead highlighted by a scoring pass by Beck as Brown turned a the short the pass into a 62-yard touchdown play. BYU vs. TULSA GAME RECAPS

TULSA, September 15, 2007 - Senior quarterback Paul Smith passed for a career-high 454 yards and five touchdowns to lead Tulsa to a wild 55-47 victory over BYU. In a game in which the teams with proud passing traditions combined for 1,289 yards, including 1,027 in the air, it was four second-half takeaways (two interceptions and two fumble recoveries) by the Tulsa defense and two penalties on a late BYU possession that spelled the difference. BYU drove to a first down at the Tulsa 12 with just over two minutes left, but consecutive false starts bumped the Cougars back to the 22 and quarterback Max Hall misfired on four consecutive passes from there. Hall also passed for a career-high 526 yards, completing 34 of 57 passes with four touchdowns and two interceptions. His final completion was fumbled by Andrew George and recovered by Tulsa's Steve Craver, allowing the Golden Hurricane to run out the clock on a game that lasted three hours and 57 minutes. BYU amassed 694 yards and Hall's 526 passing yards were the most ever allowed by Tulsa, which had 595 total yards with 490 of those through the air. After a BYU fumble, Smith directed a 74-yard drive that sealed the win for Tulsa by completing his fifth TD pass of the game with a 37-yard scoring strike to Corey Heinz.
